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29 including the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938, the 30 Davis-Bacon Act, the McNamara-O'Hara Service Contract Act of 1965, the Migrant and Seasonal Agricultural Worker Protection 31 32 Act, the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, the 33 Copeland "Anti-kickback" Act, this chapter, and s. 24, Art.
