A bill to be entitled

An act relating to legislative travel reimbursement; amending s. 11.13, F.S.; authorizing legislators and their staff members to be reimbursed by the state under certain circumstances for travel to visit an immediate family member in the case of death or serious illness; defining the term "immediate family member"; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 11.13, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

14 11.13 Compensation of members.—

(2) (a) During the time the Legislature is in session, each legislator shall be paid subsistence at a rate to be established by the President of the Senate for members of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives for members of the House. Each legislator, in addition to subsistence, shall be paid travel expenses in accordance with s. 112.061(7) and (8) for actual travel between the legislator's home and the seat of government for not more than one round trip per week or fraction of a week during any regular, special, or extraordinary session of the Legislature or for the convening of either the House or Senate for official business.

(b) If the cost of travel to visit an immediate family member in the case of death or serious illness is less than the cost of travel between the legislator's or staff member's home and the seat of government, each legislator and his or her staff

members shall be paid travel expenses in accordance with s.

112.061(7) and (8) for travel from the seat of government to
visit an immediate family member in the case of death or serious
illness for one single round trip during any regular, special,
or extraordinary session of the Legislature or for the convening
of either the House or Senate for official business. As used in
this paragraph, the term "immediate family member" means a
person having one of the following relationships to another:
husband, wife, father, mother, son, or daughter.
Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.
