5 (g) Adopt bylaws or policies that require student athletes 6 who are suspected of sustaining a concussion or head injury in a 7 practice or competition to be immediately removed from the 8 activity. A student athlete who has been removed may not return 9 to practice or competition until the student receives written 10 clearance to return from a physician licensed under chapter 458 11 or chapter 459 who is certified by the American Board of Neurological Surgery or the American Board of Orthopaedic 12 Surgery, certified in Orthopaedic Sports Medicine by the 13

28	care provider licensed or certified under s. 458.347, s.

30	maintains a formal supervisory relationship or an established		
31	written protocol that identifies the medical acts or evaluations
