## Senate Amendment

4 and insert:

5 (g) The organization shall adopt bylaws or policies that 6 require student athletes who are suspected of sustaining a 7 concussion or head injury in a practice or competition to be 8 immediately removed from the activity. A student athlete who has 9 been removed may not return to practice or competition until the student receives written clearance to return from a physician 10 11 licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 459 who is certified by the American Board of Neurological Surgery or the American Board 12 of Orthopaedic Surgery, certified in Orthopaedic Sports Medicine 13

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14	by the American Board of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation,
15	certified in Neuromuscular Medicine, Spinal Cord Injury
16	Medicine, or Sports Medicine by the American Board of Psychiatry
17	and Neurology, certified in Clinical Neurophysiology,
18	Neurodevelopmental Disabilities, or Neuromuscular Medicine, or a
19	physician licensed under chapter 460 who is certified by the
20	Academy of Chiropractic Orthopedists, the American Board of
21	Chiropractic Orthopedics, or the American Chiropractic Neurology
22	Board, or certified as a chiropractic sports physician. The
23	written clearance must state that the student athlete no longer
24	exhibits signs, symptoms, or behaviors consistent with a
25	concussion or other head injury. Before issuing a written
26	clearance to return to practice or competition, a physician may:
27	1. Delegate the performance of medical acts to a health
28	care practitioner licensed or certified under s. 458.347, s.
29	459.022, s. 464.012, or s. 468.707 with whom the physician
30	maintains a formal supervisory relationship or an established
31	written protocol that identifies the medical acts or evaluations
32	to be performed and conditions for their performance and that
33	attests to proficiency in the evaluation and management of
34	concussions.
35	2. Consult with, or utilize testing and evaluation of
36	cognitive functions performed by, a neuropsychologist licensed
37	under chapter 490.

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
