State agencies are encouraged to consider shared savings financing of such energy-31 32 efficiency and conservation projects, using contracts that which 33 split the resulting savings for a specified period of time 34 between the state agency and the private firm or cogeneration 35 contracts and that which otherwise permit the state to lower its net energy costs. Such energy contracts may be funded from the 36 37 operating budget.
