HB 495 2011

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the emergency fire rescue services and facilities surtax; amending s. 212.055, F.S.; revising and limiting the authorized uses for which the proceeds from the surtax may be expended; requiring that any review required by ordinance or local agreement to determine the need for continuing the surtax begin within a certain time after imposition of the surtax or completion of a prior review; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (8) of section 212.055, Florida Statutes, is amended, and paragraph (k) is added to that subsection, to read:

212.055 Discretionary sales surtaxes; legislative intent; authorization and use of proceeds.—It is the legislative intent that any authorization for imposition of a discretionary sales surtax shall be published in the Florida Statutes as a subsection of this section, irrespective of the duration of the levy. Each enactment shall specify the types of counties authorized to levy; the rate or rates which may be imposed; the maximum length of time the surtax may be imposed, if any; the procedure which must be followed to secure voter approval, if required; the purpose for which the proceeds may be expended; and such other requirements as the Legislature may provide. Taxable transactions and administrative procedures shall be as provided in s. 212.054.

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(8) EMERGENCY FIRE RESCUE SERVICES AND FACILITIES SURTAX.-

(a) The governing authority of a county, other than a county that has imposed two separate discretionary surtaxes without expiration, may, by ordinance, levy a discretionary sales surtax of up to 1 percent for emergency fire rescue services and facilities as provided in this subsection. As used in this subsection, the term "emergency fire rescue services" is limited to maintaining firefighting equipment, conducting fire safety classes, and establishing or undertaking fire prevention measures only during the times when a jurisdiction is susceptible to fires; includes, but is not limited to, preventing and extinguishing fires; protecting and saving life and property from fires or natural or intentional acts or disasters; enforcing municipal, county, or state fire prevention codes and laws pertaining to the prevention and control of fires; and providing prehospital emergency medical treatment.

(k) If any ordinance or interlocal agreement required under this subsection includes a provision requiring a review or periodic reviews to determine whether imposition of the discretionary sales surtax continues to remain necessary, the first review must begin within 4 years after imposition of the discretionary sales surtax and any later review must begin within 4 years after completion of any prior review.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.
