17	Section 1. Section 1012.465, Florida Statutes, is amended

21	(1) Except as provided in s. 1012.467 or s. 1012.468,
22	noninstructional school district employees or contractual
23	personnel who are permitted access on school grounds when
24	students are present, who have direct contact with students or
25	who have access to or control of school funds must meet level 2
26	screening requirements as described in s. 1012.32 and hold valid
27	certification pursuant to this section. Contractual personnel

The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services 30 (2) shall fingerprint and conduct background checks through the 31 32 Department of Law Enforcement for employees and contractual 33 personnel described in subsection (1) and issue a valid 34 statewide certificate signifying that a person has met the 35 uniform, statewide level 2 screening requirements as described in s. 1012.32. 36 37 (3) (a) The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall issue a valid statewide certificate if the applicant: 38 39 1. Is a resident of the United States and a citizen of the 40 United States or a permanent resident alien of the United States 41 as determined by the United States Bureau of Citizenship and 42 Immigration Services; 43 2. Is 18 years or older; and 44 3. Meets the screening standards of s. 435.04. (b) Certificates issued by the Department of Agriculture 45 and Consumer Services must bear a color photograph of the 46 47 certificateholder. The certificateholder must carry the certificate and valid identification at all times in which the 48 49 certificateholder is on school grounds and must display both the certificate and valid identification upon demand by a duly 50 51 authorized school district employee. 52 (4) (2) Every 5 years following issuance of a certificate 53 for background screening employment or entry into a contract in a capacity described in subsection (1), each person who is so 54 55 employed or under contract with the school district must meet 56 level 2 screening requirements as described in s. 1012.32 and Page 2 of 4

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57 provide to the school district a valid certificate issued by the 58 Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, at which time 59 the school district shall request the Department of Law 60 Enforcement to forward the fingerprints to the Federal Bureau of 61 Investigation for the level 2 screening. If, for any reason 62 following employment or entry into a contract in a capacity 63 described in subsection (1), the fingerprints of a person who is 64 so employed or under contract with the school district are not 65 retained by the Department of Law Enforcement under s. 66 1012.32(3)(a) and (b), the person must file a complete set of 67 fingerprints with the district school superintendent of the 68 employing or contracting school district. Upon submission of 69 fingerprints for this purpose, the school district shall request 70 the Department of Law Enforcement to forward the fingerprints to 71 the Federal Bureau of Investigation for the level 2 screening, 72 and the fingerprints shall be retained by the Department of Law 73 Enforcement under s. 1012.32(3)(a) and (b). The cost of the 74 application for a certificate for background screening shall be 75 borne by the contractor or the person fingerprinted and the cost 76 of the state and federal criminal history check required by 77 level 2 screening may be borne by the district school board, the 78 contractor $_{\tau}$  or the person fingerprinted. Under penalty of 79 perjury, each person who is employed or under contract in a 80 capacity described in subsection (1) must agree to inform his or 81 her employer or the party with whom he or she is under contract within 48 hours if convicted of any disqualifying offense while 82 he or she is employed or under contract in that capacity. 83 84 The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (5)

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85	shall retain a file of certificateholders and shall check the
86	file against the Florida Criminal Information Center database a
87	minimum of every 3 months throughout the term of the
88	certificate. If any person who is employed or under contract in
89	a capacity described in subsection (1) is found to have become
90	disqualified under the provisions of this section, the
91	Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services shall notify the
92	school district and the contractor that such person no longer
93	meets the level 2 screening requirements as described in s.
94	<u>1012.32.</u>
95	(6) (3) If it is found that a person who is employed or
96	under contract in a capacity described in subsection (1) does
97	not meet the level 2 requirements, the person shall be
98	immediately suspended from working in that capacity and shall
99	remain suspended until final resolution of any appeals.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.

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
