16	populations both locally and worldwide, and
17	WHEREAS, unlike other fish species, most sharks do not
18	reach sexual maturity until 7 to 12 years of age and then give
19	birth to only a small litter of young; thus, sharks cannot
20	rebuild their populations quickly once overfished, and
21	WHEREAS, the practice of shark finning, whereby a shark is
22	caught, the fin is cut off, and the shark is returned to the
23	water, causes millions of sharks to die a slow death each year
24	by starvation, predation, and drowning because sharks need to
25	keep moving in order to force water through their gills for
26	oxygen, and
27	WHEREAS, shark fin is the principal ingredient in certain
28	delicacies for which demand has risen, and
29	WHEREAS, fishers continue the practice of shark finning on

32	WHEREAS, the state's waters will suffer harm if the
33	practice of shark finning continues, NOW, THEREFORE,

35	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
36	
37	Section 1. Possession, sale, trade, or distribution of
38	shark fins prohibited
39	(1) A person may not possess, sell, offer for sale, trade,
40	or distribute a shark fin in this state or on the waters of this
41	state.
42	(2) As used in this section, the term "shark fin" means the
43	raw or dried fin of a shark from which the shark carcass is
44	removed.
45	(3) A person who violates this section or any rule adopted
46	pursuant to this section is subject to:
47	(a) Seizure and forfeiture of the shark fin; and
48	(b) An administrative fine of not less than \$5,000 and not
49	more than \$15,000.
50	
51	In addition, the violator may be assessed administrative fees
52	and costs and attorney fees and costs.
53	(4) The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission may adopt
54	rules to administer this section.
55	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.
