(1) In addition to the locations specified in 18 19 section 790.06(12)(a), Florida Statutes, a person may not openly 20 carry a handgun, concealed weapon, or firearm into: 21 The Broward County Governmental Center or the Broward (a) 22 County Governmental Center West. 23 (b) County-owned or county-operated facilities providing addiction recovery services, including admissions assessment, 24 detoxification services, or residential and nonresidential day 25 26 treatment or outpatient addiction recovery services. 27 County-owned or county-operated facilities providing (C) 28 healthcare services, including behavioral health services, Page 1 of 3

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29 primary care services, substance abuse services, and AIDS and 30 HIV services. (d) County-owned or county-operated facilities providing 31 32 direct services to children, the elderly, or veterans. 33 (e) County-owned or county-operated facilities providing 34 services to victims of sexual assault or child abuse, including crisis stabilization, counseling services, or child protection 35 36 team services. 37 (f) County-owned or county-operated facilities providing homeless services, homeless prevention services, housing 38 39 services, or other services designed to assist individuals and 40 families in becoming self-sufficient. 41 (g) County-owned, county-operated, or county-contracted 42 vehicles or conveyances used in providing public transit, as 43 defined in section 341.031(6), Florida Statutes. 44 (h) The primary city hall building of a municipality or another building designated by resolution of the governing body 45 46 of a municipality within Broward County as containing the chief 47 administrative offices of the municipality. 48 (i) City-owned or county-operated facilities providing 49 services described in paragraphs (b)-(f). 50 The K.C.
