the sale of license plates issued under this section shall be

Each owner or lessee of an automobile or truck for 58 (2)59 private use, truck weighing not more than 7,999 pounds, or recreational vehicle as specified in s. 320.08(9)(c) or (d), 60 61 which is not used for hire or commercial use, who is a resident of the state and who is a former prisoner of war, or their 62 63 unremarried surviving spouse, shall, upon application therefor 64 to the department, be issued a license plate as provided in s. 320.06, on which license plate are stamped the words "Ex-POW" 65 66 followed by the serial number. 77 A person who was serving as a civilian with the (b) 78 consent of the United States Government, or a person who was a 79 member of the Armed Forces of the United States who was not a 80 United States citizen and was held as a prisoner of war when the 81 Armed Forces of the United States were engaged in combat, or 82 their unremarried surviving spouse, may be issued the special 83 license plate provided for in this subsection upon payment of 84 the license tax imposed by s. 320.08.
