Chapter 57-1118, Laws of Florida, as amended by 12 13 chapter 79-426, Laws of Florida, is amended to read: 14 Section 1. There is hereby created a board of trustees to 15 be known as the "Board of Trustees, John A. H. Murphree Law 16 Library, ", which board shall consist of five (5) members: the 17 chief judge of the Eighth Judicial Circuit of Florida, one member to represent the Board of County Commissioners of Alachua 18 19 said County to be chosen by the said board biennially, the clerk of the circuit court of the said county, and two (2) practicing 20 21 attorneys of the said county to be appointed by the president of 22 the bar association of the Eighth Judicial Circuit of Florida. 23 At the time this act takes effect, one (1) practicing attorney 24 shall be appointed for a term ending April 1, 1958, and one (1)25 for a term ending April 1, 1959; on April 1, 1958, and annually 26 thereafter, one (1) practicing attorney shall be appointed for a 27 term of two (2) years. The Said board of trustees shall have full power and authority to establish, operate, and maintain a 28 Page 1 of 3

29 law library, to be known as the "John A. H. Murphree Law 30 Library" in the Alachua County Library District Headquarters courthouse, Alachua County, Florida, and to prescribe rules and 31 32 regulations as to the said board's functions and organization, and the use, maintenance, and operation of the said law library. 33 34 Section 2. Each member of the bar engaged in the practice 35 of law in said county and not exempt from payment of an 36 occupational license as such shall be required to pay in 37 addition to the annual county occupational license tax the sum of five dollars (\$5.00) which shall constitute and be considered 38 39 as an integral part and portion of the county occupational tax payable in said county. The proceeds of such additional county 40 41 occupational tax as assessed and collected shall be turned over 42 by the county tax collector of said county to the board of 43 trustees each year to be kept and expended as hereinafter 44 provided. Section 3. There shall be taxed and collected by the clerk 45 of the circuit court of said county, the sum of five dollars 46 47 (\$5.00) as costs in each civil cause at law or in equity commenced therein, in addition to the costs otherwise provided 48 49 by law, the whole of which sum shall be set apart by said clerk 50 and turned over at the end of each month to the board of

51 trustees herein established; provided, however, that said board 52 of trustees may, from time to time by resolution direct said

56 Section <u>2.</u> 4. The board of county commissioners of said 57 county is authorized to appropriate other available funds for 58 the use of the said law library.

Section 3. 5. All funds for the use of the said law 59 60 library shall be placed by the said board of trustees in a fund to be known as the "Alachua County Law Library Fund," which may 61 62 said fund shall be expended by the said board of trustees only for the purpose of establishing, operating, and maintaining a 63 64 law library as herein provided, including securing furnishings and equipment and employing necessary personnel appropriate 65 66 thereto.

67 Section <u>4.</u> 6. Upon the creation of the Alachua county law 68 library, All donations to the <u>law library</u> same and all property 69 in anywise acquired by donations, purchase, or otherwise shall 70 be deemed to be held and used by <u>the said</u> board of trustees as a 71 charitable public trust for the benefit and use of the 72 inhabitants of Alachua County, Florida, and shall be exempt from 73 all taxation.

74 Section <u>5.</u> 7. All laws and parts of laws in conflict with 75 this act be, and the same are <u>superseded to the extent of such</u> 76 <u>conflict</u> hereby repealed.

Section <u>6.</u> 8. If any clause, section, or other part of this act shall be held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutional or invalid part shall be considered as eliminated and in no wise affecting the validity of the other provisions of this act.
