24 25 An act relating to pecans; prohibiting the removal of certain pecans from public rights-of-way or from trees grown on private property; providing a penalty; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. Pecans on public rights-of-way; ownership; prohibitions; penalty.—
- (1) Pecans that fall onto public rights-of-way from trees grown on private property which extend over public roads, streets, or highway rights-of-way are the property of the owner of the pecan trees.
- (2) It is a misdemeanor of the second degree to remove pecans from:
- (a) A public right-of-way without the permission of the owner of the pecan tree.
- (b) A pecan tree grown on private property, or cause pecans to fall from such tree, without the permission of the owner of the pecan tree.
- (3) A person who violates this section commits a misdemeanor of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083, Florida Statutes.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.
