(3) Each district school board shall provide 150 minutes
of physical education each week for students in kindergarten
through grade 5 and for students in grade 6 who are enrolled in
a school that contains one or more elementary grades so that on
any day during which physical education instruction is conducted
there are at least 30 consecutive minutes per day.
