Senator Bennett moved the following:

Senate Amendment to Amendment (588096) (with title amendment)

Between lines 1761 and 1762 insert:

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Section 19. Subsection (3) and paragraph (a) of subsection (4) of section 464.012, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

464.012 Certification of advanced registered nurse practitioners; fees.-

10 (3) An advanced registered nurse practitioner shall perform 11 those functions authorized in this section within the framework 12 of an established protocol that is filed with the board upon 13 biennial license renewal and within 30 days after entering into



14 a supervisory relationship with a physician or changes to the 15 protocol. The board shall review the protocol to ensure compliance with applicable regulatory standards for protocols. 16 17 The board shall refer to the department licensees submitting 18 protocols that are not compliant with the regulatory standards 19 for protocols. A practitioner currently licensed under chapter 20 458, chapter 459, or chapter 466 shall maintain supervision for directing the specific course of medical treatment. Within the 21 2.2 established framework, an advanced registered nurse practitioner 23 may:

24 (a) Order, administer, monitor, and alter any drug or drug 25 therapies that are necessary for the proper medical care and treatment of a patient, including Schedule II through Schedule V 26 27 controlled substances under chapter 893 and those drugs agreed 28 upon by the advanced registered nurse practitioner and the 29 supervising practitioner and specified in the protocol. An 30 advanced registered nurse practitioner may order or administer 31 such drugs under the following conditions:

32 <u>1. The drugs are ordered or administered by an advanced</u> 33 <u>registered nurse practitioner in accordance with a protocol</u> 34 <u>developed by the advanced registered nurse practitioner and the</u> 35 <u>supervising practitioner, and the drugs ordered are consistent</u> 36 <u>with the advanced registered nurse practitioner's educational</u> 37 <u>preparation or for which clinical competency has been</u> 38 <u>established and maintained.</u>

39 <u>2. The protocol covering the order or administration of</u> 40 <u>drugs specifies the name of the advanced registered nurse</u> 41 <u>practitioner who may administer or order drugs, the drugs that</u> 42 <u>may be ordered and the circumstances under which they may be</u>

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43	ordered, the extent of the practitioner's supervision of the
44	advanced registered nurse practitioner, and the method for
45	periodic reviewing the advanced registered nurse practitioner's
46	competence, including peer review. The protocol for
47	administering Schedule II controlled substances must address the
48	illness, injury, or condition for which a Schedule II controlled
49	substance is administered.
50	3. The administering or ordering of drugs by an advanced
51	registered nurse practitioner occurs under practitioner
52	supervision. As used in this paragraph, the term "practitioner
53	supervision" means a collaboration between the advanced
54	registered nurse practitioner and the supervising practitioner
55	on the development of the protocol and the availability of the
56	supervising practitioner via telephonic contact at the time the
57	patient is examined by the advanced registered nurse
58	practitioner. The term does not mean that the physical presence
59	of the supervising practitioner is required. A practitioner may
60	not supervise more than four advanced registered nurse
61	practitioners at any one time.
62	4. The controlled substances are administered or ordered in
63	accordance with a patient-specific protocol approved by the
64	treating or supervising practitioner if Schedule II or Schedule
65	III controlled substances are administered or ordered by the
66	advanced registered nurse practitioner. A copy of the section of
67	the advanced registered nurse practitioner's protocol relating
68	to controlled substances must be provided upon request to the
69	licensed pharmacist who dispenses the drugs.
70	5. The board has certified that the advanced registered
71	nurse practitioner has satisfactorily completed:

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72	a. At least 6 months of direct supervision in the
73	administering and ordering of drugs; and
74	b. A course in pharmacology covering the order, use,
75	administration, and dispensing of controlled substances.
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77	The board shall adopt rules to administer this paragraph.
78	(b) Initiate appropriate therapies for certain conditions.
79	(c) Perform additional functions as may be determined by
80	rule in accordance with s. 464.003(2).
81	(d) Order diagnostic tests and physical and occupational
82	therapy.
83	(4) In addition to the general functions specified in
84	subsection (3), an advanced registered nurse practitioner may
85	perform the following acts within his or her specialty:
86	(a) The certified registered nurse anesthetist may, to the
87	extent authorized by established protocol approved by the
88	medical staff of the facility in which the anesthetic service is
89	performed, perform any or all of the following:
90	1. Determine the health status of the patient as it relates
91	to the risk factors and to the anesthetic management of the
92	patient through the performance of the general functions.
93	2. Based on history, physical assessment, and supplemental
94	laboratory results, determine, with the consent of the
95	responsible physician, the appropriate type of anesthesia within
96	the framework of the protocol.
97	3. Order under the protocol preanesthetic medication.
98	4. Perform under the protocol procedures commonly used to
99	render the patient insensible to pain during the performance of
100	surgical, obstetrical, therapeutic, or diagnostic clinical

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101 procedures. These procedures include ordering and administering 102 regional, spinal, and general anesthesia; inhalation agents and 103 techniques; intravenous agents and techniques; and techniques of 104 hypnosis.

105 5. Order or perform monitoring procedures indicated as 106 pertinent to the anesthetic health care management of the 107 patient.

108 6. Support life functions during anesthesia health care,
109 including induction and intubation procedures, the use of
110 appropriate mechanical supportive devices, and the management of
111 fluid, electrolyte, and blood component balances.

112 7. Recognize and take appropriate corrective action for 113 abnormal patient responses to anesthesia, adjunctive medication, 114 or other forms of therapy.

115 8. Recognize and treat a cardiac arrhythmia while the 116 patient is under anesthetic care.

9. Participate in management of the patient while in the postanesthesia recovery area, including ordering the administration of fluids and drugs, including those drugs that are commonly used to alleviate pain.

10. Place special peripheral and central venous andarterial lines for blood sampling and monitoring as appropriate.
