23 Section 1. Section 1003.4205, Florida Statutes, is amended 24 to read:

25 1003.4205 Disability history and awareness instruction.26 (1) Each district school board <u>shall may</u> provide disability
27 history and awareness instruction in all K-12 public schools in
28 the district during the first 2 weeks in October each year. The
29 district school board shall designate these 2 weeks as

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30	"Disability History and Awareness Weeks." The Department of
31	Education shall assist in creating the curriculum for the
32	disability history and awareness instruction that will be used
33	in each school district.
34	(2)(a) During this 2-week period, students <u>shall</u> may be
35	provided intensive instruction to expand their knowledge,
36	understanding, and awareness of individuals <u>who have</u> with
37	disabilities, the history of disability, and the disability
38	rights movement. Disability history <u>must</u> may include the events
39	and timelines of the development and evolution of services to,
40	and the civil rights of, individuals who have with disabilities.
41	Disability history <u>must</u> may also include the contributions of
42	specific individuals who have with disabilities, including the
43	contributions of acknowledged national leaders.
44	(b) Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, the
45	instruction <u>shall</u> may be integrated into the existing school
46	curriculum in ways including, but not limited to, supplementing
47	lesson plans, holding school assemblies, or providing other
48	school-related activities. The instruction <u>shall</u> may be
49	delivered by individual presenters who have disabilities and who
50	have been approved by the Department of Education as presenters
51	qualified school personnel or by knowledgeable guest speakers,
52	with a particular focus on including individuals with
53	disabilities.
54	(c)1. The Department of Education shall establish a
55	disability history and awareness advisory council. The council
56	shall consist of the following members:
57	a. The Commissioner of Education or his or her designee.
58	b. The Florida Youth Council, a group of young people ages

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59	15 to 17, and emerging young leaders ages 18 to 30, who live in
60	this state and have disabilities or special health care needs.
61	c. A member of the House of Representatives, appointed by
62	the Speaker of the House of Representatives, or his or her
63	designee.
64	d. A member of the Senate, appointed by the President of
65	the Senate, or his or her designee.
66	2. The department shall provide a liaison to assist the
67	council in its operation. The department shall act as the fiscal
68	agent for all financial transactions required by the council.
69	3. The responsibilities of the council shall be, but are
70	not limited to:
71	a. Ensuring that each presenter has first-hand knowledge
72	and experience pertaining to the challenges facing individuals
73	who have disabilities;
74	b. Ensuring that members of the Florida Youth Council in
75	this state continue to remain involved in leadership
76	development, self-advocacy, peer mentoring, and other activities
77	that will improve the quality of life for youth and emerging
78	leaders who have disabilities;
79	c. Ensuring that each presenter meets the background
80	screening requirements of s. 1012.465; and
81	d. Submitting an annual report to the Governor, the
82	President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
83	Representatives, and the superintendent of each school district
84	in this state.
85	4. The council shall meet at least four times a year and
86	more often as needed.
87	(3) The goals of disability history and awareness

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581-01715-12 2012554c1 88 instruction include: 89 (a) Better treatment for individuals who have with disabilities, especially for youth in school, and increased 90 91 attention to preventing the bullying or harassment of students 92 who have with disabilities. (b) Encouragement to individuals who have with disabilities 93 94 to develop increased self-esteem, resulting in more individuals 95 who have with disabilities gaining pride in being an individual 96 with a disability, obtaining postsecondary education, entering the workforce, and contributing to their communities. 97 (c) Reaffirmation of the local, state, and federal 98 99 commitment to the full inclusion in society of, and the equal

opportunity for, all individuals who have with disabilities. 100

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Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
