## Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete lines 121 - 256

and insert:

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(g) Developing <u>guidelines</u> administrative procedures relating to solicitation, review, and award of research grants and fellowships, to ensure an impartial, high-quality peer review system.

(h) Developing and supervising research peer review panels. (h) (i) Reviewing reports of peer review panels and making recommendations for research grants and fellowships.

(i) (j) Developing and providing oversight regarding

(b) Grants and fellowships shall be awarded by the State Surgeon General, after consultation with the council, on the basis of scientific merit, as determined by <u>the competitively</u> an open, <u>peer-reviewed</u> <del>competitive peer review</del> process <u>to ensure</u> <del>that ensures</del> objectivity, consistency, and high quality. The following types of applications <u>may shall</u> be considered for funding:

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1. Investigator-initiated research grants.

- 2. Institutional research grants.
- 3. Predoctoral and postdoctoral research fellowships.

25 (6) To ensure that all proposals for research funding are 26 appropriate and are evaluated fairly on the basis of scientific 27 merit, the department State Surgeon General, in consultation 28 with the council, shall appoint a peer review panels panel of 29 independent, scientifically qualified individuals to review the scientific merit content of each proposal and establish its 30 31 scientific priority score. The priority scores shall be forwarded to the council and must be considered in determining 32 which proposals shall be recommended for funding. 33
