Successful completion of a high school level Algebra I 20 or geometry course is not contingent upon the student's 21 performance on the end-of-course assessment required under s. 22 1008.22(3)(c)2.a.(I). However, beginning with the 2011-2012 23 school year, to earn high school credit for an Algebra I course, a middle school student must pass the Algebra I end-of-course 24 25 assessment, and beginning with the 2012-2013 school year, to 26 earn high school credit for a geometry course, a middle school 27 student must pass the geometry end-of-course assessment.

28 3. Three middle school or higher courses in social studies, one semester of which must include the study of state 29 30 and federal government and civics education. Beginning with students entering grade 6 in the 2012-2013 school year, one of 31 these courses must be at least a one-semester civics education 32 33 course that a student successfully completes in accordance with s. 1008.22(3)(c) and that includes the roles and 34 35 responsibilities of federal, state, and local governments; the structures and functions of the legislative, executive, and 36 37 judicial branches of government; and the meaning and 38 significance of historic documents, such as the Articles of 39 Confederation, the Declaration of Independence, and the Constitution of the United States. 40

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44 course assessment required under s. 1008.22(3)(c)2.a.(II). 45 However, beginning with the 2012-2013 school year, to earn high 46 school credit for a Biology I course, a middle school student 47 must pass the Biology I end-of-course assessment.

48 5. One course in career and education planning to be 49 completed in 6th, 7th, or 8th grade. The course may be taught by 50 any member of the instructional staff; must result in a 51 completed personalized academic and career plan for the student; 52 must emphasize technology or the application of technology in 53 career fields; and, beginning in the 2014-2015 academic year, 54 must include information from the Department of Economic 55 Opportunity's economic security report as described in s. 445.07 56 must include career exploration using Florida CHOICES or a comparable cost-effective program; must include educational 57 58 planning using the online student advising system known as 59 Florida Academic Counseling and Tracking for Students at the 60 Internet website FACTS.org; and shall result in the completion 61 of a personalized academic and career plan. The required 62 personalized academic and career plan must inform students of 63 high school graduation requirements, high school assessment and college entrance test requirements, Florida Bright Futures 64 65 Scholarship Program requirements, state university and Florida 66 College System institution admission requirements, and programs 67 through which a high school student can earn college credit, 68 including Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, Advanced International Certificate of Education, dual 69 70 enrollment, career academy and career-themed course

74 A student with a disability, as defined in s. 1007.02(2), for 75 whom the individual education plan team determines that an end-76 of-course assessment cannot accurately measure the student's 77 abilities, taking into consideration all allowable 78 accommodations, shall have the end-of-course assessment results 79 waived for purposes of determining the student's course grade and completing the requirements for middle grades promotion. 80 81 Each school must hold a parent meeting either in the evening or 82 on a weekend to inform parents about the course curriculum and 83 activities. Each student shall complete a an electronic personal education plan that must be signed by the student; the student's 84 85 instructor, guidance counselor, or academic advisor; and the 86 student's parent. The Department of Education shall develop 87 course frameworks and professional development materials for the 88 career exploration and education planning course. The course may 89 be implemented as a stand-alone course or integrated into 90 another course or courses. The Commissioner of Education shall collect longitudinal high school course enrollment data by 91 92 student ethnicity in order to analyze course-taking patterns.
