12	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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14	Section 1. Section 458.3137, Florida Statutes, is amended
15	to read:
16	458.3137 Temporary certificate for visiting physicians to
17	obtain medical privileges for instructional purposes in
18	conjunction with certain plastic surgery or other medical or
19	surgical training programs and <del>plastic surgery</del> educational
20	symposiums
21	(1) <u>A</u> any physician who has been invited by both:
22	(a) A plastic surgery <u>or other medical or surgical</u> training
23	program <del>that is</del> affiliated with a medical school <u>in</u> <del>within</del> this
24	state <u>which</u> <del>that</del> is accredited by the Accreditation Council for
25	Graduate Medical Education or the American Osteopathic
26	Association or which is part of a teaching hospital as defined
27	<u>in s. 408.07</u> ; <u>or</u> <del>and</del>
28	(b) An educational symposium cosponsored by the American
29	Society of Plastic Surgeons, the Plastic Surgery Educational

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31	Surgery, or any other medical or surgical society in conjunction
32	with a medical school or teaching hospital as defined in s.
33	408.07,

35	may be issued a temporary certificate for limited privileges
36	solely for purposes of providing educational training in plastic
37	surgery or other medical or surgical procedures, as appropriate,
38	in accordance with the restrictions set forth in this section.
39	(2) A temporary certificate to practice medicine for
40	educational purposes to help teach plastic surgery <u>or other</u>
41	medical or surgical procedures to residents in a training
42	program affiliated with a medical school that is accredited by
43	the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education or the
44	American Osteopathic Association or that is part of a teaching
45	hospital, or to residents of a medical school within this state
46	in conjunction with a nationally sponsored educational symposium
47	or an educational symposium held by a state medical school or
48	teaching hospital, may be issued without examination, upon
49	verification by the board that the individual meets all of the
50	following requirements:
51	(a) Is a graduate of an accredited medical school or its
52	equivalent or is a graduate of a foreign medical school listed
53	with the World Health Organization.
54	(b) Holds a valid and unencumbered license to practice
55	medicine in another state or country.
56	(c) Is a recognized expert in a specific area of plastic
57	surgery <u>or another field of medicine or surgery,</u> as demonstrated
58	by peer-reviewed publications, invited lectureships, and

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59	academic affiliations.
60	(d) Has completed an application form adopted by the board
61	and remitted a nonrefundable application fee not to exceed \$300.
62	(e) Has not committed an act in this or any other
63	jurisdiction that would constitute a basis for disciplining a
64	physician under s. 456.072 or s. 458.331.
65	(f) Meets the financial responsibility requirements of s.
66	458.320(1) or (2).
67	(g) Is applying only in connection with <u>a training program</u>
68	or an educational symposium as described in subsection (1) both
69	a medical school within this state that is accredited by the
70	Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education and an
71	educational symposium sponsored by the American Society of
72	Plastic Surgeons, the Plastic Surgery Educational Foundation, or
73	the American Society for Aesthetic Plastic Surgery.
74	(3) A temporary certificate issued under this section is
75	valid for <u>up to 5</u> <del>no more than 3</del> days per year $_{m  au}$ and <del>such</del>
76	certificate expires 1 year after issuance.
77	(4) The department may shall not issue more than $\underline{12}$ six
78	temporary certificates for a single educational symposium under
79	this section <del>per calendar year</del> .
80	(5) In order for a physician who is a graduate of a foreign
81	medical school and holds a valid and unencumbered license to
82	practice medicine in another country but does not hold a license
83	to practice medicine in this or another state to obtain a
84	temporary certificate under this section, the organization
85	sponsoring the educational symposium must pay for any medical
86	judgments incurred by that physician by obtaining a surety bond
87	issued by a surety company authorized to do business in this

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88	state <u>, by</u> <del>or</del> establishing a certificate of deposit or a
89	guaranteed letter of credit with a licensed and insured bank or
90	savings institution located in the state, or by providing proof
91	that the physician is covered under a teaching hospital's
92	medical malpractice insurance. The amount of the bond,
93	certificate of deposit, or guaranteed letter of credit <u>must</u>
94	shall be at least an amount not less than \$250,000.
95	(6) A physician applying under this section is exempt from
96	the requirements of ss. 456.039-456.046. All other provisions of
97	chapter 456 and this chapter apply.
98	(7) The board <u>may</u> <del>shall</del> not issue a temporary certificate
99	for practice to any physician who is under investigation in
100	another jurisdiction for an act that would constitute a
101	violation of this chapter or chapter 456 until such time as the
102	investigation is complete and the physician is found innocent of
103	all charges.
104	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2013.

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
