(5) It is unlawful for any person or agent of such person to knowingly file with the board any notice, statement, or other document <u>that</u> which is false or <u>that</u> which contains any material misstatement of fact. (6) There is hereby created the Certified Public

(a) The council shall consist of five licensed Floridacertified public accountants selected by the board, of whom one

shall be a representative of the National Association of Black
Accountants, one shall be a representative of the Cuban American

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- 73 CPA Association, and two shall be selected at large. At least74 one member of the council must be a woman.
- (b) The board shall determine the terms for initialappointments and appointments thereafter.

(c) Any vacancy on the council shall be filled in the manner provided for the selection of the initial member. Any member appointed to fill a vacancy of an unexpired term shall be appointed for the remainder of that term.

(d) Three consecutive absences or absences constituting 50 percent or more of the council's meetings within any 12-month period shall cause the council membership of the member in question to become void, and the position shall be considered vacant.

(e) The members of the council shall serve without
compensation, and any necessary and actual expenses incurred by
a member while engaged in the business of the council shall be
borne by such member or by the organization or agency such
member represents. However, the council member who is a member
of the board shall be compensated in accordance with ss.
455.207(4) and 112.061.
