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Amendment No. 73 license to practice medicine in another country but does not 74 hold a license to practice medicine in this or another state to 75 obtain a temporary certificate under this section, the 76 organization sponsoring the educational symposium must pay for 77 any medical judgments incurred by that physician by obtaining a 78 surety bond issued by a surety company authorized to do business 79 in this state, by or establishing a certificate of deposit or a 80 quaranteed letter of credit with a licensed and insured bank or 81 savings institution located in the state, or by providing proof 82 that the physician is covered under a teaching hospital's or medical school's medical malpractice insurance.
