5 (4)(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b), each report 6 required by this section must contain:

7 1. The full name, address, and occupation, if any of each person who has made one or more contributions to or for such 8 9 committee or candidate within the reporting period, together 10 with the amount and date of such contributions. For 11 corporations, the report must provide as clear a description as practicable of the principal type of business conducted by the 12 corporation. However, if the contribution is \$100 or less or is 13 from a relative, as defined in s. 112.312, provided that the 14 15 relationship is reported, the occupation of the contributor or the principal type of business need not be listed. 16

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17 2. The name and address of each political committee from 18 which the reporting committee or the candidate received, or to 19 which the reporting committee or candidate made, any transfer of 20 funds, together with the amounts and dates of all transfers.

3. Each loan for campaign purposes to or from any person or political committee within the reporting period, together with the full names, addresses, and occupations, and principal places of business, if any, of the lender and endorsers, if any, and the date and amount of such loans.

4. A statement of each contribution, rebate, refund, or
other receipt not otherwise listed under subparagraphs 1.
through 3.

5. The total sums of all loans, in-kind contributions, and other receipts by or for such committee or candidate during the reporting period. The reporting forms shall be designed to elicit separate totals for in-kind contributions, loans, and other receipts.

The full name and address of each person to whom 34 6. 35 expenditures have been made by or on behalf of the committee or 36 candidate within the reporting period; the amount, date, and 37 purpose of each such expenditure; and the name and address of, 38 and office sought by, each candidate on whose behalf such 39 expenditure was made. However, expenditures made from the petty cash fund provided by s. 106.12 need not be reported 40 individually. 41

42 7. The full name and address of each person to whom an 43 expenditure for personal services, salary, or reimbursement for 44 authorized expenses as provided in s. 106.021(3) has been made 158875

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45 and which is not otherwise reported, including the amount, date, 46 and purpose of such expenditure. However, expenditures made from 47 the petty cash fund provided for in s. 106.12 need not be 48 reported individually. Receipts for reimbursement for authorized 49 expenditures shall be retained by the treasurer along with the 50 records for the campaign account.

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51 8. The total amount withdrawn and the total amount spent
52 for petty cash purposes pursuant to this chapter during the
53 reporting period.

54 9. The total sum of expenditures made by such committee or55 candidate during the reporting period.

56 10. The amount and nature of debts and obligations owed by 57 or to the committee or candidate, which relate to the conduct of 58 any political campaign.

59 11. Transaction information for each credit card purchase.
60 Receipts for each credit card purchase shall be retained by the
61 treasurer with the records for the campaign account.

62 12. The amount and nature of any separate interest-bearing 63 accounts or certificates of deposit and identification of the 64 financial institution in which such accounts or certificates of 65 deposit are located.

13. The primary purposes of an expenditure made indirectly through a campaign treasurer pursuant to s. 106.021(3) for goods and services such as communications media placement or procurement services, campaign signs, insurance, and other expenditures that include multiple components as part of the expenditure. The primary purpose of an expenditure shall be that
