The normal retirement benefit, 27 including any past or additional retirement credit, may not 28 exceed 100 percent of the average final compensation. The amount of monthly benefit shall be calculated as the product of A and 29 B, subject to the adjustment of C, if applicable, as set forth 30 31 below:
