The chair of the State Board of Education and the 6 (3) 7 chair of the Board of Governors, or their designees, shall jointly appoint faculty committees to identify statewide general 8 9 education core course options. General education core course options shall consist of a maximum of five courses within each 10 of the subject areas of communication, mathematics, social 11 sciences, humanities, and natural sciences. The core courses may 12 be revised or the five-course cap within each subject area 13 14 exceeded if approved by the State Board of Education and the 15 Board of Governors, as recommended by the subject area faculty 16 committee and approved by the Articulation Coordinating 17 Committee as necessary for a subject area.
