Senate Amendment to Amendment (740626) (with title 1 2 amendment) 3 4 Between lines 4378 and 4379 5 insert: 6 Section 85. (1) The Florida Transportation Commission, in 7 cooperation with the Florida Seaport Transportation Economic 8 Development Council, shall conduct a statewide study to evaluate 9 the feasibility of consolidating any existing port districts and 10 port authorities, and all of their assets, rights, powers, 11 authority, duties, and bond liabilities, into one or more port

- 12 districts and port authorities.
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(2) The study shall evaluate and develop findings and

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14	recommendations regarding the feasibility and benefits of
15	consolidating any of the existing port districts and port
16	authorities and all of their assets, rights, powers,
17	authorities, duties, debts, and bond liabilities, into one or
18	more single port districts and port authorities.
19	(3) The study shall review and consider those matters it
20	deems relevant, including, but not limited to, the following:
21	(a) The lands and facilities, including submerged lands,
22	owned or leased by each identified port district and port
23	authority.
24	(b) The current land use designations and county zoning
25	designations for such locations and facilities.
26	(c) The current services provided by each of the existing
27	ports.
28	(d) The conditions and length of each contract or lease for
29	the use of the existing port facilities, income generated by
30	each contract or lease, renewal options available, and the
31	obligations and debts owed to the existing port facilities under
32	each contract or lease.
33	(e) Contracts and leases with vendors, service providers,
34	and others.
35	(f) The income and expenses of each port, including, but
36	not limited to, salaries and benefits, current and projected
37	pension and other similar retirement obligations, and number,
38	years of service, and employment status of all employees.
39	(g) The master plan and five-year operational plan of each
40	of the existing ports, including proposed staffing, building
41	acquisition or construction, debt issuance, and budget of each
42	of the existing ports.

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43	(h) The fiscal capacity of the existing ports.
44	(i) Security plans and costs associated with implementing
45	the plans, including all contracts for the provision of security
46	at the existing ports.
47	(j) All current, proposed, or anticipated improvements,
48	development, or construction in the areas under the jurisdiction
49	of the existing ports.
50	(k) All agreements between the existing ports and any
51	common carrier, and any port terminal operator.
52	(1) Any collective bargaining agreements.
53	(m) All permits issued by any governmental entity affecting
54	or related to the existing ports.
55	(n) Any pending governmental permits or permit
56	applications.
57	(o) Finance plans, bond obligations, loans, pledges of
58	revenue, liens, or other financing arrangements related to the
59	existing ports or the existing ports facilities.
60	(p) The feasibility of constructing and managing a new
61	cruise terminal west of the Skyway Bridge.
62	(q) The efficacy of the use of public-private partnerships
63	and public-private operating partnerships with respect to any
64	consolidated port district and port authority.
65	(4) The final report shall address the matters identified
66	in this section and any other matters the commission and the
67	council deem relevant to the creation of one or more
68	consolidated port authorities. The final report shall be
69	submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the
70	Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 31, 2013.
