Section 27. (1) The Legislature ratifies and approves the actions of the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement

Trust Fund regarding lease numbers 1447, 1971s, 3420, 3433, and 3543, and lease numbers 3422 and 1935/1935-S as approved on January 23, 2013, subject to the terms and conditions established by the board of trustees as approved on January 23, 2013.
