20	Department of Agriculture (USDA) under the Animal Welfare Act,
21	the printed name, city and state of residence, and USDA license
22	numbers assigned to the breeder of the cat or dog, must be
23	displayed continuously on or next to the enclosure of the dog or
24	cat for sale and must be continuously displayed in any print or
25	electronic advertisements for the sale of a cat or dog, and must
26	be easily readable by a customer.

27	Section 2. Section 828.295, Florida Statutes, is created

29	828.295 Sales of live cats and dogs prohibited at flea

31	(1) As used in this section, the term "flea market" means
32	a swap meet or flea market, open-air market, or other organized
33	event at which two or more persons offer merchandise for sale or
34	exchange.
35	(2) A person may not willfully sell, offer for sale or
36	exchange, offer for donation, display, or donate any live dog or
37	cat at any flea market.
38	(3) This section does not apply to county-operated or
39	municipally-operated animal control agencies or to nonprofit
40	humane organizations that qualify as exempt charitable
41	organizations under s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
42	(4) A person who violates this section:
43	(a) For the first violation, commits a misdemeanor of the
44	second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s.
45	775.083.
46	(b) For a second or subsequent violation, commits a
47	misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s.
48	775.082 or s. 775.083.
