Section 123. Effective October 1, 2014, section 849.0931,

Florida Statutes, is transferred, renumbered as section 551.53,

Florida Statutes, and amended to read:

<u>551.53</u> 849.0931 Bingo authorized; conditions for conduct; permitted uses of proceeds; limitations.—

- (1) As used in this section:
- (a) "Bingo" or "bingo game" means and refers to the activity, commonly known as "bingo," in which participants pay a sum of money to play and the winner of the game receives a prize for the use of one or more bingo cards. When the game commences, numbers are selected at random drawn by chance, one by one, and

announced. the players cover or mark <u>matching</u> those numbers on their the bingo cards which they have purchased until a <u>card</u> contains a specific pattern of marked numbers matching the player receives a given order of numbers in sequence that has been preannounced <u>pattern</u> for that particular game. This player calls out "bingo" and is declared the winner of the a predetermined prize. More than one game may be played upon a bingo card, and numbers called for one game may be used for a succeeding game or games.

- (b) "Bingo card" means each individual predetermined arrangement of numbers conforming to the rules of the game which is available for purchase by the players. While bingo games may use bingo cards of various formats, the traditional bingo card contains a grid of five columns containing five rows containing numbers from 1 through 75, inclusive, with the letters "B I N G O" printed on the card over the top of the columns and with the center square on the card marked with the word "free." and refers to the flat piece of paper or thin pasteboard employed by players engaged in the game of bingo. The bingo card shall have not fewer than 24 playing numbers printed on it. These playing numbers shall range from 1 through 75, inclusive. More than one set of bingo numbers may be printed on any single piece of paper.
- (c) "Bingo card minder" means a device that may be used by a player to play bingo or instant bingo.
 - 1. At a minimum, each bingo card minder must:

- b. Provide a means to mark bingo cards when randomly determined numbers are conveyed or reveal the contents of instant bingo tickets.
- c. Identify winning bingo cards or winning instant bingo tickets.
 - 2. A bingo card minder must not:
- a. Be capable of accepting or dispensing any coins or currency.
- b. Be capable of monitoring any bingo cards or instant bingo tickets other than those cards or tickets purchased by the player.
 - c. Determine the outcome of any game.
 - d. Display spinning reels.
- 3. This paragraph does not limit or prevent any bingo card minder functionality, including:
- a. Communication protocols for the two-way transmission of game information, including, but not limited to, bingo cards or instant bingo tickets, prize values, selected numbers, and predetermined patterns; and
- b. Accounting mechanisms to manage the accounting of player winnings, the sale of bingo cards, or the sale of instant bingo tickets.
- (d) (c) "Charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization" means an organization that which has qualified for exemption

from federal income tax as an exempt organization under the provisions of s. 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or s. 528 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; that which is engaged in charitable, civic, community, benevolent, religious, or scholastic works or other similar activities; and that which has been in existence and active for a period of 3 years or more.

- (e) (d) "Deal" means an individual game of instant bingo containing a separate set or package of not more than 25,000 4,000 instant bingo tickets in which the predetermined minimum prize payout is at least 65 percent of the total receipts from the sale of the entire deal.
- <u>(f) (e)</u> "Flare" means the <u>information</u> board or placard that accompanies each deal of instant bingo tickets and that <u>provides</u> the player with has printed on or affixed to it the following information:
 - 1. The game name.
 - 2. The manufacturer's name or distinctive logo.
 - 3. The form number.
 - 4. The ticket count.
- 5. The prize structure, including the number of symbols or number combinations for winning instant bingo tickets by denomination, with their respective winning symbols or number combinations.
 - 6. The cost per instant bingo ticket play.
 - 7. The game serial number.

- $\underline{\text{(i)}}_{\text{(h)}}$ "Rack" means the container in which the objects are placed after being drawn and announced.
- $\underline{\text{(j)}}$ "Receptacle" means the container from which the objects are drawn or ejected.
- $\underline{\text{(k)}}$ "Session" means a designated set of games played in a day or part of a day.

- (1) "Test lab" means an accredited testing laboratory that has been certified by the Gaming Standards Association or the North American Gaming Regulators Association or has been licensed as an accredited test facility in at least three states, other than Florida, that regulate gaming activities and issue such accreditations pursuant to state law.

Any net proceeds remaining after paying prizes may be used as specified in subsection (3) or may be donated by the association to a charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization that which is exempt from federal income tax under the provisions of s. 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code to be used in such recipient organization's charitable, civic, community, benevolent, religious, or scholastic works or similar activities or, in the alternative, such remaining proceeds shall be used as specified in subsection (3).

(5) (a) Except for instant bingo prizes, which are limited to the amounts displayed on the <u>instant bingo</u> ticket or on the game flare, a jackpot <u>may shall</u> not exceed \$500 the value of \$250 in actual money or its equivalent, and there <u>may not shall</u> be no more than three jackpots in any one session of bingo.

(b) (6) Except for instant bingo, which is not limited by this subsection, the number of days per week during which organizations authorized under this section may conduct bingo no more than 2 days per week shall not exceed two.

(c) (7) Except for instant bingo prizes, which are limited to the amounts displayed on the <u>instant bingo</u> ticket or on the game flare, there <u>may not shall</u> be no more than three jackpots on any one <u>session of bingo</u> day of play. All other game prizes may shall not exceed \$100 \$50.

(6) (8) Each person involved in conducting a the conduct of any bingo game or instant bingo must be a resident of the community where the organization is located and a bona fide member of the organization sponsoring such game and may not be compensated in any way for operation of such game. When bingo games or instant bingo is conducted by a charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization, the organization conducting the games must designate up to three members of that organization to be in charge of the games, one of whom shall be present during the entire session at which the games are conducted. The organization conducting the games is responsible for posting in a conspicuous place on the premises at which the session is held or instant bingo is played a notice stating, which notice states the name of the organization and the designated member or members, in a conspicuous place on the premises at which the session is held or instant bingo is played. A caller in a bingo game may not be a participant in that bingo game.

(7) (9) Every charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization involved in the conduct of a bingo game or instant bingo must be located in the county, or within a 15-mile radius of, where the bingo game or instant bingo is conducted located.

- (8) (10) (a) A person No one under 18 years of age may not shall be allowed to play any bingo game or instant bingo or be involved in the conduct of a bingo game or instant bingo in any way.
- (b) Any organization conducting bingo open to the public may refuse entry to any person who is objectionable or undesirable to the sponsoring organization, but such refusal of entry shall not be on the basis of race, creed, color, religion, sex, national origin, marital status, or physical handicap.
- $\underline{(9)}$ (11) Bingo games or instant bingo may be held only on the following premises:
- (a) Property owned by the charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization.
- (b) Property owned by the charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization that will benefit from by the proceeds.
- (c) Property leased <u>or subleased</u> for a period of not less than 1 year by a charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organization, providing the lease or rental agreement does not provide for the payment of a percentage of the proceeds generated at such premises to the lessor or any other party and providing the rental rate for such premises does not exceed the rental rates charged for similar premises in the same locale.
- (d) Property owned by a municipality or a county when the governing authority has, by appropriate ordinance or resolution, specifically authorized the use of such property for the conduct of such games.

- (e) With respect to bingo games conducted by a condominium association, a cooperative association, a homeowners' association as defined in s. 720.301, a mobile home owners' association, a group of residents of a mobile home park as defined in chapter 723, or a group of residents of a mobile home park or recreational vehicle park as defined in chapter 513, property owned by the association, property owned by the residents of the mobile home park or recreational vehicle park, or property that which is a common area located within the condominium, mobile home park, or recreational vehicle park.
- $\underline{\text{(10)}}$ (12) Each bingo game shall be conducted in accordance with the following rules:
- through the selection of objects, the objects, whether drawn or ejected, shall be essentially equal as to size, shape, weight, and balance and as to all other characteristics that may control their selection from the receptacle. The caller shall cancel any game if, during the course of a game, the mechanism used in the drawing or ejection of objects malfunctions becomes jammed in such a manner as to interfere with the accurate determination of the next number to be announced or if the caller determines that more than one object is labeled with the same number or that there is a number to be drawn without a corresponding object. Any player in a game canceled pursuant to this paragraph shall be permitted to play the next game free of charge.
 - (b) If the random determination of number is accomplished

through the selection of objects, before Prior to commencement of any bingo session, the member in charge shall cause a verification to be made of all objects to be placed in the receptacle and shall inspect the objects in the presence of a disinterested person to ensure that all objects are present and that there are no duplications or omissions of numbers on the objects. Any player shall be entitled to call for a verification of objects numbers before, during, and after a session.

- (d) Each number randomly determined shall be conveyed to all players participating in the game All numbers shall be visibly displayed after being drawn and before being placed in the rack.
- (e) A winning bona fide bingo card shall contain marked numbers that correspond to those numbers randomly determined and conveyed to the players in such an arrangement that matches the predetermined pattern consist of a predesignated arrangement of numbers on a card or sheet that correspond with the numbers on the objects drawn from the receptacle and announced. Errors in numbers announced or misplaced in the rack may not be recognized as a bingo.
- (f) When a caller has started to vocally announce a number, the caller shall complete the call. If any player has

obtained a bingo on a previous number, such player will share the prize with the player who gained bingo on the last number called.

- (g) Numbers on the winning cards or sheets shall be announced and verified in the presence of another player. Any player shall be entitled at the time the winner is determined to call for a verification of numbers drawn. The verification shall be in the presence of the member designated to be in charge of the occasion or, if such person is also the caller, in the presence of an officer of the licensee.
- (h) Upon determining a winner, the caller shall ask, "Are there any other winners?" If no one replies, the caller shall declare the game closed. No other player is entitled to share the prize unless she or he has declared a bingo prior to this announcement.
- (f)(i) Seats may not be held or reserved by an organization or person involved in the conduct of any bingo game for players not present, nor may any cards be set aside, held, or reserved from one session to another for any player.
- (g) Before use, bingo card minders and associated system software must be examined by a test lab for compliance with this section.
- (11) (13) (a) Instant bingo tickets must be sold at the price displayed printed on the ticket or on the game flare by the manufacturer, not to exceed \$2\$ \$1. Discounts may not be given for the purchase of multiple tickets, nor may tickets be

- (b) Each deal of instant bingo tickets must be accompanied by a flare, and the flare must be available for view by players posted before and during the sale of instant bingo any tickets in that deal.
- (c) Each instant bingo ticket in a deal must bear the same serial number, and there may not be more than one serial number in each deal. Serial numbers <u>displayed</u> printed on a deal of instant bingo tickets may not be repeated by the manufacturer on the same form for a period of 3 years.
- (d) The serial number for each deal must be clearly and legibly placed on the outside of each deal's package, box, or other container.
- (d) (e) Instant bingo tickets manufactured, sold, or distributed in this state must comply with the <u>intent of</u> applicable standards on pull-tabs of the North American Gaming Regulators Association, as amended; however, such compliance may not limit any new technology or advancement of existing technology.
- <u>(e) (f)</u> Except as provided <u>in</u> under paragraph (e), an instant bingo ticket manufactured, sold, or distributed in this state must:
- 1. Be manufactured so that it is not possible to identify whether it is a winning or losing instant bingo ticket until it has been opened by the player as intended.
 - 2. Be manufactured using at least a two-ply paper stock

- 3. Have the form number, the deal's serial number, and the name or logo of the manufacturer conspicuously <u>displayed</u> printed on its the face or cover of the instant bingo ticket.
- 4. Have a form of winner protection that allows the organization to verify, after the instant bingo ticket has been played, that the winning instant bingo ticket presented for payment is an authentic winning instant bingo ticket for the deal in play. The manufacturer shall provide a written description of the winner protection with each deal of instant bingo tickets.
- (12) (a) (g) Each manufacturer and distributor that sells leases, rents, or distributes bingo cards, instant bingo tickets, or bingo card minders in this state to charitable, nonprofit, or veterans' organizations shall prepare an invoice that contains the following information for each product provided:
 - 1. The date of sale.
- 2. A description of the product Form number and serial number of each deal sold.
- 3. The quantity of the product Number of instant bingo tickets in each deal sold.
- 4. The name of the distributor or organization to whom each product was provided deal is sold.
 - 5. The price of the product each deal sold.
 - (b) All information contained on an invoice must be
