8	receive funding; authorizing the department to
9	administer contracts on behalf of a municipality;
10	requiring funded projects to be included in the
11	department's work program; providing an effective
12	date.

14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

16	Section 1. Disadvantaged cities road improvement
17	(1) This section may be cited as the "Disadvantaged Cities
18	Road Improvement Act."
19	(2) The Legislature recognizes that it is in the public
20	interest to provide a source of funding for disadvantaged cities
21	to resurface or reconstruct municipal roads. The Legislature
22	find that investment in disadvantaged cities that meet the
23	criteria in this section has a high probability of creating
24	jobs, increasing economic activity, improving safety, and
25	increasing property values to assist disadvantaged cities to
26	achieve and maintain economic sustainability.
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27 (3) There is created the Disadvantaged Cities Road 28 Assistance Program within the Department of Transportation. The 29 purpose of the program is to assist disadvantaged municipal 30 governments in resurfacing or reconstructing municipal roads. 31 (4) As used in this section, the term "disadvantaged city" 32 means a municipality: 33 That has a population of 40,000 or less according to (a) 34 the most recent federal census; 35 (b) With at least 25 percent of its population below the 36 poverty level; and That has a combined millage rate exceeding 8.5 mills 37 (C) 38 in its most recent fiscal year. 39 Beginning with fiscal year 2014-2015, up to \$25 (5) 40 million annually from the State Transportation Trust Fund may be 41 used for the purposes of funding the Disadvantaged Cities Road 42 Assistance Program. Disadvantaged cities may compete for funds that have 43 (6) 44 been designated for the program for resurfacing or 45 reconstruction projects on roads that were part of the municipal 46 road system on January 1, 2010. Capacity improvements on 47 municipal roads are not eligible for funding under the program. 48 In determining a municipality's eligibility for funds (a) 49 under the program, the Department of Transportation may consider 50 whether the municipality has attempted to keep its roads in 51 satisfactory condition. The Department of Transportation may 52 also consider the extent to which the municipality has offered Page 2 of 3

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53	to provide a match of local funds for the state funds provided
54	under the program. To receive funds under the program, a
55	municipality must provide at least 25 percent of the total
56	project cost.
57	(b) The following criteria must be used to prioritize road
58	projects for funding:
59	1. The primary criteria are:
60	a. The physical condition of the road as measured by the
61	department.
62	b. Whether the road is to be resurfaced or reconstructed
63	as part of a municipality's comprehensive resurfacing or
64	reconstruction of the road, including whether the municipality
65	will contemporaneously install or repair utilities related to
66	the road, including water, sewer, drainage, or sidewalks.
67	2. The secondary criteria are:
68	a. Whether the road is used as an evacuation route or
69	leads to an evacuation route.
70	b. Whether the a road is within a 1-mile radius of a
71	school.
72	(7) The Department of Transportation may administer
73	contracts on behalf of a municipality selected to receive
74	funding for a project under this section. All projects funded
75	under this section shall be included in the Department of
76	Transportation's work program.
77	Section 2. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
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
