1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to public records; amending s. 3 403.7032, F.S.; exempting trade secret information in 4 annual recycling reports submitted by private businesses to a county from public records 5 6 requirements; providing for future repeal and 7 legislative review of the exemption under the Open 8 Government Sunset Review Act; providing a statement of 9 public necessity; providing an effective date. 10 11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 12 Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 403.7032, Florida 13 Statutes, is amended to read: 14 15 403.7032 Recycling.-(3) (a) Each state agency, public institution of higher 16 17 learning, community college, and state university, including all 18 buildings that are occupied by municipal, county, or state 19 employees and entities occupying buildings managed by the 20 Department of Management Services, must, at a minimum, annually 21 report annually all recycled materials to the county using the 22 department's designated reporting format. Private businesses, other than certified recovered 23 (b) 24 materials dealers, which that recycle paper, metals, glass, 25 plastics, textiles, rubber materials, and mulch $_{\tau}$  are encouraged 26 to report annually the amount of materials they recycle to the Page 1 of 3

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27 county annually beginning January 1, 2011, using the 28 department's designated reporting format.

29 <u>1.</u> Using the information provided, the department shall 30 recognize those private businesses that demonstrate outstanding 31 recycling efforts.

32 <u>2.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of state or county 33 law, private businesses, other than certified recovered 34 materials dealers, <u>may shall</u> not be required to report recycling 35 rates.

36 3. Information reported under this paragraph which, if 37 disclosed, would reveal a trade secret, as defined in s. 38 812.081, is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 39 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. This subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance 40 41 with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2019, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through enactment by the 42 43 Legislature.

(c) Municipalities Cities with less than a population of less than 2,500 and per capita taxable value less than \$48,000 and <u>municipalities</u> cities with a per capita taxable value less than \$30,000 are exempt from the reporting requirement specified in this subsection.

49 Section 2. <u>The Legislature finds that it is a public</u> 50 <u>necessity that information reported by a private business which,</u> 51 <u>if disclosed, would reveal a trade secret be confidential and</u> 52 <u>exempt from public records requirements. This exemption is</u>

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53	necessary to encourage businesses to report information relating
54	to their recycling practices, so they can be recognized for
55	their outstanding recycling efforts. Public disclosure of
56	proprietary information could result in a chilling effect on
57	business participation in the program. Therefore, the
58	Legislature declares that it is a public necessity that the
59	information reported by private businesses which, if disclosed,
60	would reveal a trade secret be made confidential and exempt from
61	public records requirements.
62	Section 3. This act shall take effect October 1, 2014.

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
