16	Section 1. Mental health first aid training program
17	(1) The Department of Children and Families shall
18	establish a mental health first aid training program to help the
19	public identify and understand the signs of mental illness and
20	substance use disorders and provide the public with skills to
21	help a person who is developing or experiencing a mental health
22	or substance use problem.
23	(2) The training program shall provide an interactive
24	mental health first aid training course through contracts with
25	behavioral health managing entities or other appropriate
26	community providers. The contracting entity shall work
27	cooperatively with local schools to provide for training to the
28	staff in schools as a first priority, when appropriate.

29 The training program shall include, but is not limited (3) 30 to: 31 An overview of mental illnesses and substance use (a) 32 disorders and the need to reduce the stigma of mental illness. 33 Information on the potential risk factors and warning (b) 34 signs of mental illness or substance use disorders, including 35 depression, anxiety, psychosis, eating disorders, and self-36 injury, and common treatments for those conditions. 37 An action plan that encompasses the skills, resources, (C) and knowledge required to assess the situation, select and 38 39 implement appropriate interventions, and help an individual with 40 appropriate professional, peer, social, or self-help care. 41 The department shall ensure that instructors in the (4) 42 training program have been certified by a national authority 43 representing Mental Health First Aid USA. 44 The department shall submit a report on the (5) 45 effectiveness of the mental health first aid training program 46 provided pursuant to this act, with recommendations regarding 47 continued implementation of the program. The report shall be 48 submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the 49 Speaker of the House of Representatives by December 31, 2016. 50 (6) This section expires June 30, 2017. 51 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
