35	6. Proposed changes to the ordinance that established the
36	special district and justification for such changes.
37	7. Any other information reasonably required to provide the
38	reviewing entity with an accurate understanding of the purpose
39	for which the special district exists and how it is fulfilling

41	8. Any reasons for the special district's noncompliance.
42	9. Whether the special district is currently in compliance.
43	10. Plans to correct any recurring issues of noncompliance.
