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27	(1) The governing body of a county may create a yellow dot								
28	critical motorist medical information program to facilitate the								
29	provision of emergency medical care to program participants by								
30	emergency medical responders by making critical medical								
31	information readily available to responders in the event of a								
32	motor vehicle accident or a medical emergency involving a								
33	participant's vehicle.								
34	(2)(a) The governing body of a county may solicit								
35	sponsorships from business entities and not-for-profit								
36	organizations to cover the costs of the program, including the								
37	cost of decals and folders that must be provided free of charge								
38	to participants. Two or more counties may enter into an								
39	interlocal agreement to solicit such sponsorships.								
40	(b) The Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles or								
41	the Department of Transportation may provide education and								
42	training to encourage emergency medical responders to								
43	participate in the program and may take reasonable measures to								
44	publicize the program.								
45	(3) Any owner or lessee of a motor vehicle may participate								
46	in the program upon submission of an application and								
47	documentation in the form and manner prescribed by the governing								
48	body of the county.								
49	(a) The application form must include a statement that the								
50	information submitted will be disclosed only to authorized								
51	personnel of law enforcement and public safety agencies,								
52	emergency medical services agencies, and hospitals for the								
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53	purposes authorized in subsection (5).								
54	(b) The application form must describe the confidential								
55	nature of the medical information voluntarily provided by the								
56	participant and must include a notice to the participant stating								
57	that, by providing the medical information and signing the form								
58	he or she agrees to the disclosure of the medical information to								
59	authorized personnel and their use of such information solely								
60	for the purposes listed in subsection (5).								
61	(c) The county may not charge a fee to participate in the								
62	yellow dot program.								
63	(4) A participant shall receive a yellow dot decal, a								
64	yellow dot folder, and a form containing the personal and								
65	medical information provided by the participant.								
66	(a) The participant shall affix the decal onto the rear								
67	window in the left lower corner of a motor vehicle or in a								
68	clearly visible location on a motorcycle.								
69	(b) A person who rides in a motor vehicle as a passenger								
70	may also participate in the program but may not be issued a								
71	decal if a decal has been issued to the owner or lessee of the								
72	motor vehicle in which the person rides.								
73	(c) The yellow dot folder, which shall be stored in the								
74	glove compartment of the motor vehicle or in a compartment								
75	attached to a motorcycle, shall contain a form with the								
76	following information about the participant:								
77	1. The participant's name.								
78	2. The participant's photograph.								
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79	3. Emergency contact information for no more than two									
80	persons.									
81	4. The participant's medical information, including									
82	medical conditions, recent surgeries, allergies, and current									
83	medications.									
84	5. The participant's hospital preference.									
85	6. Contact information for no more than two physicians.									
86	(5)(a) If the driver or a passenger of a motor vehicle is									
87	involved in a motor vehicle accident or emergency situation and									
88	a yellow dot decal is affixed to the vehicle, an emergency									
89	medical responder at the scene may search the glove compartment									
90	of the vehicle for the corresponding yellow dot folder.									
91	(b) The use of the information contained in the yellow dot									
92	folder by an emergency medical responder at the scene is limited									
93	to the following purposes:									
94	1. To positively identify the participant.									
95	2. To ascertain whether the participant has a medical									
96	condition that might impede communications between the									
97	participant and the responder.									
98	3. To access the medical information form.									
99	4. To ensure that the participant's current medications									
100	and preexisting medical conditions are considered when emergency									
101	medical treatment is administered for any injury to or condition									
102	of the participant.									
103	(6) The governing body of a participating county shall									
104	adopt guidelines and procedures to prevent the public disclosure									
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105	of confidential information through the program.
