Paragraphs (d) and (e) of subsection (1) of 18 section 492.105, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: 492.105 19 Licensure by examination; requirements; fees.-20 Any person desiring to be licensed as a professional (1)geologist shall apply to the department to take the licensure 21 22 examination. The written licensure examination shall be designed 23 to test an applicant's qualifications to practice professional 24 geology, and shall include such subjects as will tend to 25 ascertain the applicant's knowledge of the theory and the 26 practice of professional geology and may include such subjects 27 as are taught in curricula of accredited colleges and 28 universities. The department shall examine each applicant who
