2	An act relating to pharmacy; amending s. 456.42, F.S.;				
3	requiring written prescriptions for specified				
4	controlled substances to be dated in a specified				
5	format; amending s. 465.014, F.S.; providing the				
6	number of registered pharmacy technicians a licensed				
7	pharmacist may supervise if approved by the Board of				
8	Pharmacy after considering certain factors; requiring				
9	the board to authorize a licensed pharmacist to				
10	supervise more than three pharmacy technicians if a				
11	licensee is employed by certain entities; requiring a				
12	licensee to provide the board with notice of				
13	employment status under certain circumstances;				
14	amending s. 465.189, F.S.; authorizing pharmacists to				
15	administer meningococcal and shingles vaccines under				
16	6 certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

18	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

20	Section 1. Subsection (2) of section 456.42, Florida				
21	Statutes, is amended to read:				
22	456.42 Written prescriptions for medicinal drugs				
23	(2) A written prescription for a controlled substance				
24	listed in chapter 893 must have the quantity of the drug				
25	prescribed in both textual and numerical formats, must be dated				
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26 on the prescription in numerical, month/day/year format or with 27 the abbreviated month written out, or the month written out in whole on the face of the prescription, and must be either 28 29 written on a standardized counterfeit-proof prescription pad 30 produced by a vendor approved by the department or 31 electronically prescribed as that term is used in s. 408.0611. As a condition of being an approved vendor, a prescription pad 32 vendor must submit a monthly report to the department that 33 34 which, at a minimum, documents the number of prescription pads 35 sold and identifies the purchasers. The department may, by rule, require the reporting of additional information. 36

37 Section 2. Subsection (1) of section 465.014, Florida38 Statutes, is amended to read:

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465.014 Pharmacy technician.-

40 A person other than a licensed pharmacist or pharmacy (1) 41 intern may not engage in the practice of the profession of 42 pharmacy, except that a licensed pharmacist may delegate to 43 pharmacy technicians who are registered pursuant to this section 44 those duties, tasks, and functions that do not fall within the purview of s. 465.003(13). All such delegated acts must shall be 45 performed under the direct supervision of a licensed pharmacist 46 47 who is shall be responsible for all such acts performed by persons under his or her supervision. A registered pharmacy 48 49 registered technician, under the supervision of a pharmacist, may initiate or receive communications with a practitioner or 50

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51	his or her agent, on behalf of a patient, regarding refill		
52	authorization requests. A licensed pharmacist may supervise up		
53	to three registered pharmacy technicians not supervise more than		
54	one registered pharmacy technician unless otherwise authorized		
55	permitted by the guidelines adopted by the board <u>pursuant to</u>		
56	this subsection.		
57	(a) The board shall establish by rule circumstances under		
58	which a licensee who applies to the board for approval may		
59	guidelines to be followed by licensees or permittees in		
60	determining the circumstances under which a licensed pharmacist		
61	may supervise more than <u>three,</u> one but not more than <u>six</u>		
62	2 <u>registered</u> three pharmacy technicians. In establishing these		
63	circumstances, the board shall consider, for safety, the		
64	following factors:		
65	5 <u>1. The average number of prescriptions filled each month</u>		
66	by the pharmacy where the applicant works.		
67	2. Whether the pharmacy is a community pharmacy, nuclear		
68	pharmacy, special pharmacy, Internet pharmacy, or institutional		
69	pharmacy.		
70	3. Whether the pharmacy holds a special sterile		
71	compounding permit, or special parenteral or enteral permit.		
72	4. The pharmacy's hours of operation.		
73	5. The number of licensed pharmacists working in the		
74	pharmacy and the number of registered pharmacy technicians		
75	supervised by each pharmacist.		

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76 The board must authorize a licensee, who submits proof (b) 77 to the board that he or she is employed by an entity operating 78 an automated pharmacy system or by a pharmacy performing 79 centralized prescription filling, to supervise more than three 80 registered pharmacy technicians as long as that licensee is employed by that entity or pharmacy. The licensee must notify 81 82 the board within 30 days after the licensee is no longer 83 employed by the entity or pharmacy. 84 Section 3. Paragraphs (c) and (d) are added to subsection (1) of section 465.189, Florida Statutes, and subsection (2) of 85 that section is amended, to read: 86 465.189 Administration of vaccines and epinephrine 87 autoinjection.-88 In accordance with guidelines of the Centers for 89 (1)90 Disease Control and Prevention for each recommended immunization 91 or vaccine, a pharmacist may administer the following vaccines 92 to an adult within the framework of an established protocol 93 under a supervising physician licensed under chapter 458 or 94 chapter 459: 95 (c) Meningococcal vaccine. 96 (d) Shingles vaccine. 97 (2) In accordance with guidelines of the Centers for 98 Disease Control and Prevention, a pharmacist may administer the 99 shingles vaccine within the framework of an established protocol 100 and pursuant to a written or electronic prescription issued to

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101 the patient by a physician licensed under chapter 458 or chapter 102 459.

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Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.

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
