12		information, which must include, at a minimum, all of the
13		following: the title, all authors listed, publishers, edition
14		number, copyright date, published date, and other relevant
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15	information necessary to identify the specific textbook or
16	instructional material textbooks required and recommended for
17	each course.
18	(c) The new and used retail price and the rental price, if
19	applicable, for a required and recommended textbook or
20	instructional material for purchase at the institution's
21	designated bookstore or other specified vendor, including the
22	website or other contact information for the bookstore.

24	The State Board of Education and the Board of Governors shall
25	include in the policies, procedures, and guidelines adopted
26	under subsection (5) (4) certain limited exceptions to this
27	notification requirement for <u>courses</u> classes added after the
28	notification deadline. An institution that is unable to comply
29	with this subsection by the 2014 fall semester must provide the
30	information required by this subsection to students, in a format
31	determined by the institution, at least 60 days before the first
32	day of class. The institution must also submit a quarterly
33	report to the State Board of Education or to the Board of
34	Governors, as applicable, documenting the institution's efforts
35	to be in compliance with this subsection by the 2015 fall
36	semester.

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
