(r) A voluntary contribution of \$1 or more per applicant, which shall be distributed to the Auto Club Group Traffic Safety Foundation, Inc., a not-for-profit organization.

117 Notwithstanding s. 322.081, a voluntary contribution (s) 118 of \$1 per applicant to aid the homeless. Contributions made 119 pursuant to this paragraph shall be deposited into the Grants 120 and Donations Trust Fund of the Department of Children and 121 Families and used by the State Office on Homelessness to 122 supplement grants made under s. 420.622(4) and (5), provide 123 information to the public about homelessness in the state, and 124 provide literature for homeless persons seeking assistance.
