11	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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13	Section 1. Subsection (6) of section 338.155, Florida
14	Statutes, is amended to read:
15	338.155 Payment of toll on toll facilities required;
16	exemptions
17	(6) Personal identifying information <u>held by</u> provided to,
18	acquired by, or in the possession of the Department of
19	Transportation, a county, <u>a municipality,</u> or an expressway
20	authority for the purpose of paying, prepaying, or collecting
21	tolls and associated administrative charges due for the use of
22	using a credit card, charge card, or check for the prepayment of
23	electronic toll facilities charges to the department, a county,
24	or an expressway authority is exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s.
25	24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. <u>This exemption applies</u>
26	to such information held by the Department of Transportation, a
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27	county, a municipality, or an expressway authority before, on,
28	or after the effective date of the exemption. This subsection is
29	subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance
30	with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2019,
31	unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the
32	Legislature.
33	Section 2. The Legislature finds that it is a public
34	necessity to exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s.
35	24(a), Article I of the State Constitution personal identifying
36	information about individuals held by the Department of
37	Transportation, a county, a municipality, or an expressway
38	authority for the purpose of paying, prepaying, or collecting
39	tolls and associated administrative charges due for the use of
40	toll facilities. The Legislature also finds that it is a public
41	necessity that this exemption apply to personal identifying
42	information held by the Department of Transportation, a county,
43	a municipality, or an expressway authority before, on, or after
44	the effective date of the exemption. The exemption puts
45	individuals who pay for tolls by TOLL-BY-PLATE, which is video
46	billed, on equal footing with individuals who pay for tolls by
47	check, debit card, or credit card, or who pay cash at the toll
48	booth. The exemption protects the health and safety of the
49	public by making exempt information regarding the locations,
50	travel patterns, and travel activity of individuals as they use
51	the toll road system. The exemption protects the anonymity of
52	all travelers on toll roads, not just cash customers, regardless
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53	of the method of payment of tolls. The exemption also thereby
54	promotes the use of the electronic toll collection system, which
55	is a more efficient and effective government collection system
56	for tolls, because paying for tolls by TOLL-BY-PLATE, which is
57	video billed, or paying for tolls by check, debit card, or
58	credit card not only saves individuals time when passing through
59	the toll facilities, compared to individuals who pay for tolls
60	with cash, but also costs much less to administer. Further, the
61	exemption protects the privacy of individuals and promotes their
62	right to be let alone from unreasonable government intrusion by
63	prohibiting the public disclosure of private information about
64	the finances and location of the individual using the toll road
65	system.
66	Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
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
