A substitute who has 116 successfully completed the 3-clock-hour Fundamentals of Child 117 Care training established by rules of the department or the 30-

126 (5) (7) Operators of family child day care homes must shall be required annually to complete a health and safety home 127 128 inspection self-evaluation checklist developed by the department 129 in conjunction with the statewide resource and referral program. 130 The completed checklist shall be signed by the operator of the 131 family child day care home and provided to parents as 132 certification that basic health and safety standards are being 133 met.

134 <u>(6) (8)</u> <u>Operators of family child day care homes home</u> 135 operators may avail themselves of supportive services offered by 136 the department.

137 (7) (9) The department shall prepare a brochure on family 138 child day care for distribution by the department and by local 139 licensing agencies, if appropriate, to family child day care homes for distribution to parents using utilizing such child 140 care, and to all interested persons, including physicians and 141 142 other health professionals; mental health professionals; school 143 teachers or other school personnel; social workers or other professional child care, foster care, residential, or 144

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145 institutional workers; and law enforcement officers. The 146 brochure shall, at a minimum, contain the following information:

(a) A brief description of the requirements for family
 child day care registration, training, and <u>background</u>

(b) A listing of those counties that require licensure of family <u>child</u> day care homes. Such counties shall provide an addendum to the brochure that provides a brief description of the licensure requirements or may provide a brochure in lieu of the one described in this subsection, provided it contains all the required information on licensure and the required information in the subsequent paragraphs.

(c) A statement indicating that information about the
family <u>child</u> day care home's compliance with applicable state or
local requirements can be obtained <u>from</u> by telephoning the
department office or the office of the local licensing agency,
<u>including the</u>, if appropriate, at a telephone number or numbers
<u>and website address for the department or local licensing</u>
agency, as applicable which shall be affixed to the brochure.

(d) The statewide toll-free telephone number of the central abuse hotline, together with a notice that reports of suspected and actual child physical abuse, sexual abuse, and neglect are received and referred for investigation by the hotline.

(e) Any other information relating to competent child carethat the department or local licensing agency, if preparing a

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171 separate brochure, <u>considers</u> deems would be helpful to parents 172 and other caretakers in their selection of a family <u>child</u> day 173 care home.

174 <u>(8)(10)</u> On an annual basis, the department shall evaluate 175 the registration and licensure system for family <u>child</u> day care 176 homes. Such evaluation shall, at a minimum, address the 177 following:

(a) The number of family <u>child</u> day care homes registered
and licensed and the dates of such registration and licensure.

(b) The number of children being served in both registered
and licensed family <u>child</u> day care homes and any available slots
in such homes.

(c) The number of complaints received concerning family <u>child day</u> care, the nature of the complaints, and the resolution of such complaints.

(d) The training activities <u>used</u> utilized by child care
 personnel in family <u>child</u> day care homes for meeting the state
 or local training requirements.

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190 The evaluation shall be <u>used</u> utilized by the department in any 191 administrative modifications or adjustments to be made in the 192 registration of family <u>child</u> day care homes or in any 193 legislative requests for modifications to the system of 194 registration or to other requirements for family <u>child</u> day care 195 homes.

(11) In order to inform the public of the state

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197 requirement for registration of family day care homes as well as 198 the other requirements for such homes to legally operate in the 199 state, the department shall institute a media campaign to 200 accomplish this end. Such a campaign shall include, at a 201 minimum, flyers, newspaper advertisements, radio advertisements, 202 and television advertisements.

(9) (12) Notwithstanding any other state or local law or 203 204 ordinance, any family child day care home licensed pursuant to 205 this chapter or pursuant to a county ordinance shall be charged the utility rates accorded to a residential home. A licensed 206 207 family child day care home may not be charged commercial utility 208 rates.

209 (10) (13) The department shall, by rule, establish minimum 210 standards for family child day care homes that are required to 211 be licensed by county licensing ordinance or county licensing 212 resolution or that voluntarily choose to be licensed. The 213 standards should include requirements for staffing, training, maintenance of immunization records, minimum health and safety 214 standards, reduced standards for the regulation of child care 215 216 during evening hours by municipalities and counties, and enforcement of standards. Additionally, the department shall, by 217 rule, adopt procedures for verifying a registered family child 218 219 care home's compliance with background screening and training 220 requirements.

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(11) (14) During the months of August and September of each 222 year, Each family child day care home shall provide parents of

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children <u>enrolling</u> enrolled in the home detailed information regarding the causes, symptoms, and transmission of the influenza virus in an effort to educate those parents regarding the importance of immunizing their children against influenza as recommended by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

229 Section 11. Subsections (1), (3), (5), and (9) of section 230 402.3131, Florida Statutes, are amended, and subsection (10) is 231 added to that section, to read:

402.3131 Large family child care homes.-

(1) <u>A</u> large family child care <u>home must</u> homes shall be
licensed under this section <u>and permanently post its license in</u>
<u>a conspicuous location that is visible to all parents and</u>
guardians and the department.

(a) A licensed family <u>child</u> day care home must first have
operated for a minimum of 2 consecutive years, with an operator
who has had a child development associate credential or its
equivalent for 1 year, before seeking licensure as a large
family child care home.

(b) The department may provide technical assistance to
counties and family <u>child</u> day care home providers to enable the
counties and providers to achieve compliance with minimum
standards for large family child care homes.

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
