1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to health care; providing legislative findings; permitting a hospital that has operated as a 3 4 Level I, Level II, or pediatric trauma center for a 5 specified period to continue operating at that trauma 6 center level under certain conditions, notwithstanding 7 any other provision of law; making a hospital that 8 complies with such requirements eligible for renewal 9 of its 7-year approval period under s. 395.4025(6), 10 F.S.; requiring a hospital that obtains a trauma 11 center consultation report following the site visit to 12 provide the report to the Department of Health; 13 requiring the department to use the trauma center 14 consultation reports in any assessment of the state 15 trauma system; providing an effective date. 16 17 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 18 19 Section 1. The Legislature finds that an integrated, 20 comprehensive, and superior quality trauma system is necessary 21 to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of 22 Florida and visitors to this state. The Legislature further 23 finds that each trauma center operating in the state is an 24 integral part of the trauma system and fulfills a critical need 25 for trauma care in the area in which it is located. A disruption 26 in the operational status of a trauma center may disrupt the Page 1 of 3

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27	availability of needed trauma services for residents of and			
28	visitors to Florida. The Legislature finds that all currently			
29	operating trauma centers in the state are contributing to an			
30	inclusive trauma system and are delivering needed trauma			
31	services so that optimal trauma care is available and accessible			
32	throughout the state.			
33	Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a			
34	hospital that has operated continuously as a Level I, Level II,			
35	or pediatric trauma center for a consecutive 12-month period			
36	after the enactment of chapter 2004-259, Laws of Florida,			
37	remains operational as of the effective date of this act, and			
38	submits an application for a site visit by the American College			
39	of Surgeons Committee on Trauma on or before April 1, 2015, for			
40	the purpose of obtaining a trauma center consultation report,			
41	may continue to operate at the same trauma center level as a			
42	verified Level I, Level II, or pediatric trauma center until the			
43	approval period in s. 395.4025(6), Florida Statutes, expires as			
44	long as the hospital continues to meet the other requirements of			
45	s. 395.4025(6), Florida Statutes, related to trauma center			
46	standards and patient outcomes. A hospital that meets the			
47	requirements of this section shall be eligible for renewal of			
48	its 7-year approval period pursuant to s. 395.4025(6), Florida			
49	Statutes.			
50	Section 3. Each hospital that obtains a trauma center			
51	consultation report from the American College of Surgeons			
52	Committee on Trauma shall provide a copy of the report to the			
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53	Department of Health. The department shall use the report in any
54	assessment of the state trauma system.
55	Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
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
