2	A memorial to the Congress of the United States,
3	applying to Congress to call a convention for the sole
4	purpose of proposing an amendment to the Constitution
5	of the United States that would limit the consecutive
6	terms of office which a member of the United States
7	Senate or the United States House of Representatives
8	may serve.

10	WHEREAS Article V of the Constitution of the United States
11	requires Congress to call a convention for the sole purpose of
12	proposing amendments to the Constitution upon application of
13	two-thirds of the states, and
14	WHEREAS, a continuous and growing concern has been
15	expressed that the best interests of this nation will be served
16	by limiting the terms of members of Congress, a concern
17	expressed by the Founding Fathers and incorporated into the
18	Articles of Confederation, and
19	WHEREAS, the voters of the State of Florida, by the
20	gathering of petition signatures, placed on the general election
21	ballot of 1992 a measure to limit the consecutive years of
22	service for several offices, including the offices of United
23	States Senator and United States Representative, and
24	WHEREAS, the voters of Florida incorporated this limitation
25	into the State Constitution as Section 4, Article VI, by an

28 WHEREAS, in 1995, the United States Supreme Court ruled in 29 U.S. Term Limits, Inc. v. Thornton, 514 U.S. 779 (1995), a five-30 to-four decision, that the individual states did not possess the 31 requisite authority to establish term limits, or additional 32 qualifications, for persons elected to the United States Senate 33 or United States House of Representatives, and

34 WHEREAS, upon reflecting on the intent of the voters of 35 this state and their overwhelming support of congressional term 36 limits, the Legislature, in its 114th Regular Session since 37 Statehood in 1845, did express through a memorial to Congress the desire to receive an amendment to the Constitution of the 38 39 United States to limit the number of consecutive terms that a 40 person may serve in the United States Senate or the United 41 States House of Representatives, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature, in its 116th Regular Session since statehood in 1845, does desire to see a convention called for the sole purpose of proposing such an amendment, NOW, THEREFORE,

51 Constitution of the United States, to call a convention limited 52 to the sole purpose of proposing an amendment to the 53 Constitution limiting the number of consecutive terms which a 54 person may serve in the United States Senate or the United 55 States House of Representative.

56 (2) That this application constitutes a continuing 57 application in accordance with Article V until the Legislatures 58 of at least two-thirds of the states have made application on 59 the same subject.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be dispatched to the President of the United States, to the President of the United States Senate, to the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, to each member of the Florida delegation to the United States Congress, and to the presiding officer of each house of the legislature of each state.
