Interscholastic Extracurricular student activities are 19 (2) 20 an important complement to the academic curriculum. 21 Participation in a comprehensive extracurricular and academic 22 program contributes to student development of the social and 23 intellectual skills necessary to become a well-rounded adult. As 24 used in this section, the term "extracurricular activity" means 25 any school-authorized or education-related activity occurring during or outside the regular instructional school day, 26 27 including, but not limited to, interscholastic athletics regulated by the Florida High School Athletic Association 28 29 (FHSAA); intramural athletics; and fine or performing arts, speech and debate, and other academic or social clubs, teams, or 30 31 activities.

32 (3) (a) To be eligible to participate in interscholastic
33 extracurricular student activities, a student must:

1. Maintain a grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the previous semester or a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or above on a 4.0 scale, or its equivalent, in the courses required by s. <u>1002.3105(5)</u> <u>1003.428</u> or s. 1003.4282 <u>1003.429</u>.
