9	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

11	Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of section						
12	1012.34, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:						
13	1012.34 Personnel evaluation procedures and criteria						
14	(3) EVALUATION PROCEDURES AND CRITERIAInstructional						
15	personnel and school administrator performance evaluations must						
16	be based upon the performance of students assigned to their						
17	classrooms or schools, as provided in this section. Pursuant to						
18	this section, a school district's performance evaluation is not						
19	limited to basing unsatisfactory performance of instructional						
20	personnel and school administrators solely upon student						
21	performance, but may include other criteria approved to evaluate						
22	instructional personnel and school administrators' performance,						
23	or any combination of student performance and other approved						
24	criteria. Evaluation procedures and criteria must comply with,						
25	but are not limited to, the following:						
26	(a) A performance evaluation must be conducted for each						
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27 employee at least once a year, except that a classroom teacher, as defined in s. 1012.01(2)(a), excluding substitute teachers, 28 who is newly hired by the district school board must be observed 29 30 and evaluated at least twice in the first year of teaching in 31 the school district. The performance evaluation must be based 32 upon sound educational principles and contemporary research in 33 effective educational practices. The evaluation criteria must 34 include:

35 Performance of students.-At least 50 percent of a 1. 36 performance evaluation must be based upon data and indicators of 37 student learning growth assessed annually by statewide 38 assessments or, for subjects and grade levels not measured by 39 statewide assessments, by school district assessments as provided in s. 1008.22(8). Each school district must use the 40 41 formula adopted pursuant to paragraph (7) (a) for measuring 42 student learning growth in all courses associated with statewide 43 assessments and must select an equally appropriate formula for measuring student learning growth for all other grades and 44 45 subjects, except as otherwise provided in subsection (7).

For classroom teachers, as defined in s. 1012.01(2)(a), 46 a. 47 excluding substitute teachers, the student learning growth 48 portion of the evaluation must include growth data for students 49 assigned to the teacher over the course of at least 3 years. If 50 less than 3 years of data are available, the years for which 51 data are available must be used and the percentage of the 52 evaluation based upon student learning growth may be reduced to Page 2 of 5

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53 not less than 40 percent. <u>If a student's learning growth</u> 54 <u>declines and the student's parent fails on three or more</u> 55 <u>occasions to respond to a classroom teacher's request to meet</u> 56 <u>with the parent regarding the student's performance, that</u> 57 <u>student's learning growth data may not be used in calculating</u> 58 <u>the student learning growth portion of the evaluation.</u>

59 For instructional personnel who are not classroom b. 60 teachers, the student learning growth portion of the evaluation 61 must include growth data on statewide assessments for students assigned to the instructional personnel over the course of at 62 least 3 years, or may include a combination of student learning 63 growth data and other measurable student outcomes that are 64 specific to the assigned position, provided that the student 65 66 learning growth data accounts for not less than 30 percent of 67 the evaluation. If less than 3 years of student growth data are available, the years for which data are available must be used 68 69 and the percentage of the evaluation based upon student learning 70 growth may be reduced to not less than 20 percent.

c. For school administrators, the student learning growth portion of the evaluation must include growth data for students assigned to the school over the course of at least 3 years. If less than 3 years of data are available, the years for which data are available must be used and the percentage of the evaluation based upon student learning growth may be reduced to not less than 40 percent.

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2. Instructional practice.-Evaluation criteria used when Page 3 of 5

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79 annually observing classroom teachers, as defined in s. 80 1012.01(2)(a), excluding substitute teachers, must include indicators based upon each of the Florida Educator Accomplished 81 82 Practices adopted by the State Board of Education. For 83 instructional personnel who are not classroom teachers, 84 evaluation criteria must be based upon indicators of the Florida 85 Educator Accomplished Practices and may include specific job 86 expectations related to student support.

87 3. Instructional leadership.-For school administrators, evaluation criteria must include indicators based upon each of 88 89 the leadership standards adopted by the State Board of Education under s. 1012.986, including performance measures related to the 90 effectiveness of classroom teachers in the school, the 91 92 administrator's appropriate use of evaluation criteria and 93 procedures, recruitment and retention of effective and highly 94 effective classroom teachers, improvement in the percentage of 95 instructional personnel evaluated at the highly effective or effective level, and other leadership practices that result in 96 97 student learning growth. The system may include a means to give parents and instructional personnel an opportunity to provide 98 input into the administrator's performance evaluation. 99

4. Professional and job responsibilities.-For
instructional personnel and school administrators, other
professional and job responsibilities must be included as
adopted by the State Board of Education. The district school
board may identify additional professional and job

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105 responsibilities.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.

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
