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11	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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13	Section 1. Section 402.3053, Florida Statutes, is created
14	to read:
15	402.3053 Regulation of summer camps.—
16	(1) As used in this section, the term:
17	(a) "Operator" means any onsite person ultimately
18	responsible for the overall operation of a summer day camp or
19	summer 24-hour camp, regardless of whether the operator is the
20	owner or administrator of the camp.
21	(b) "Personnel" means all owners, operators, employees,
22	and volunteers working in a summer day camp or summer 24-hour
23	camp who may be employed by or perform volunteer work for a
24	person, corporation, or agency that operates a summer day camp
25	or summer 24-hour camp.
26	(c) "Screening" means the act of assessing the background

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of personnel and includes, but is not limited to, employment history checks as provided in chapter 435 using the level 2 standards for screening set forth in that chapter.

(d) "Summer camp" includes:

- 1. "Summer day camp," which means recreational,
  educational, and other enrichment programs operated during
  summer vacations for children who are 5 years of age or older on
  or before September 1.
- 2. "Summer 24-hour camp," which means recreational, educational, and other enrichment programs that are not exclusively educational that are operated on a 24-hour basis during summer vacation for children who are 5 years of age or older on or before September 1.
- (2) (a) The department shall create a uniform, statewide identification badge to be worn by summer camp personnel signifying that the person has met the level 2 screening requirements of chapter 435. The department shall issue the identification badge, which must bear a photograph of the person. An identification badge shall be issued if the person:
- 1. Is a resident and citizen of the United States or a permanent resident alien of the United States as determined by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services.
- 2. Meets the level 2 background screening requirements under chapter 435.
- (b) The uniform, statewide identification badge must be visible at all times that the employee or volunteer is on summer

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camp grounds.

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- (c) The identification badge shall be valid for 5 years or until the person terminates employment or is terminated or until the volunteer ceases working at the summer camp. Within 48 hours after termination or ceasing to volunteer, the person shall return the identification badge to the operator of the summer camp.
- (d) The department shall determine a uniform cost that a summer camp may charge for the identification badge, which shall be borne by the recipient of the badge.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
