| 17 | sustained a spinal cord injury, and |
| 18 | WHEREAS, it is estimated that the annual incidence of |
| 19 | spinal cord injury in the United States is about 12,000 new |
| 20 | cases, not including those who die at the scene of an accident, |
| 21 | and |
| 22 | WHEREAS, age 42 is the average age for spinal cord |
| 23 | injuries, with nearly half of all injuries occurring between the |
| 24 | ages of 16 and 30, and |
| 25 | WHEREAS, men are at much greater risk for spinal cord |
| 26 | injury, with 80.7 percent of all spinal cord injuries occurring |
| 27 | in men, and |
| 28 | WHEREAS, the four leading causes of spinal cord injury for |
| 29 | both men and women are auto accidents, falls, acts of violence, |
