## CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

## ARTICLE I, SECTION 2

DECLARATION OF RIGHTS.—Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to eliminate authority granted to the Legislature to regulate or eliminate the real property rights of aliens ineligible for citizenship. This amendment will provide that all natural persons are equal before the law and have an inalienable right to acquire, possess, and protect property, without exception.
