A bill to be entitled

An act relating to a graduation transition program; creating s. 1003.565, F.S.; defining a term; creating the ESOL Graduation Transition Program within the Department of Education; providing for eligibility and requirements for the program; requiring an eligible student to continue taking certain classes while enrolled in the program; directing the department to adopt rules; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 1003.565, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

15 1003.565 ESOL Graduation Transition Program. -

- (1) As used in this section, the term "ESOL" has the same meaning as in s. 1003.56.
- (2) The Department of Education shall create an ESOL Graduation Transition Program to provide for the transition from high school to college for students who have not been able to meet the requirements for graduation from high school in 4 years due to language barriers. To qualify for participation in the program, a student must satisfy all of the following conditions:
- (a) Have enrolled in a public high school in this state at age 15 or older.
  - (b) Be 19 years of age or older.
  - (c) Be enrolled in a public high school.
- (d) Be unable to pass the Florida Standards assessment or the courses required for graduation from a high school under s.

(e) Be qualified to participate in an ESOL program operated in accordance with a school district's approved English Language Learner plan.

- (3) A student who meets the requirements of subsection (2) may enroll in remedial classes at a Florida College System institution to work toward meeting the requirements for graduation from high school. While attending these remedial classes, a qualified student may also participate in a school's dual enrollment program and take a limited number of courses for college credit.
- (4) A student who participates in the ESOL Graduation

  Transition Program must continue to take English classes to improve his or her English language proficiency while enrolled in the program.
- (5) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to implement this section.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
