A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Florida Ethics Center; providing a short title; creating the Florida Ethics Center within the Office of Chief Inspector General in the Executive Office of the Governor; establishing the mission and duties of the center; requiring the center to be located in the Capitol Complex; providing for appropriations; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, the vitality of our constitutional form of government, a beacon of hope for several generations, requires adherence to the principles of honesty, integrity, truth, trust, and transparency in public service, and

WHEREAS, our representative democracy cannot endure without people engaging with their elected officials, and

WHEREAS, civic engagement is fostered by goodwill, honesty, and transparency, must be free of corrupting conflicts of interest and self-dealing, and must nurture a deep understanding of the responsibilities of public service, and

WHEREAS, Florida, as one of the largest, most diverse, and most prosperous states, has the opportunity and responsibility to lead other states in the study of government ethics, and

WHEREAS, there must be a concerted effort to develop a higher level of ethical leadership and to restore the people's trust in government, and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of state government to

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make government honest, transparent, uncorrupt, and free of undue influence as evidenced by the existence of the offices of inspectors general, the Commission on Ethics, cases brought by state attorneys, and laws, rules, and regulations intended to address illegal and unethical government activity, and

WHEREAS, knowledge, study, debate, and contemplation of these issues can change attitudes, approaches, and actions that cannot be changed by law and its processes alone, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. (1) This act may be cited as the "Florida Ethics Center Act."
- (2) The Florida Ethics Center is created within the Office of Chief Inspector General in the Executive Office of the Governor. The mission of the center is to help elected officials, persons seeking office, and other persons who interact with government to study applied ethics, the impact of conflicts of interest, and other issues. This mission will help disseminate a deep understanding of ethics as applied to government and business interests.
  - (3) The Florida Ethics Center shall:
- (a) Train and educate candidates and elected and appointed state and local government officials about ethical concerns that arise in government, that affect relationships among business

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interests, and that promote the public good.

- (b) Be available to other states and their local governments as a training, education, and study center, allowing Florida to emerge as a leader among states in ethical government practice and to offset the operating costs of the center.
- (c) Fund two resident ethics scholar positions selected from preeminent state research universities, as designated pursuant to s. 1001.7065, Florida Statutes.
- (d) Fund three rotating ethics scholar positions selected from state colleges and universities.
- (e) Fund visiting scholars and lecturers who periodically make presentations on ethical issues.
- (f) Fund and produce an online newsletter and journal to disseminate applied ethics and civic engagement knowledge and to encourage study, discussion, and debate. The costs of producing these publications may be offset by subscription income derived from entities and individuals beyond state and local governments.
- (g) Fund and create an annual national and international conference on government ethics.
- (h) Provide, for a fee, online and traditional educational courses, pamphlets, and training materials relating to government and applied ethics for elected officials and candidates in this state and other states. The proceeds raised from selling such materials and offering such training to entities outside this state may be used to offset production and

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- (i) Provide adequate staffing and supervision of the center's functions.
- (4) The Florida Ethics Center shall be situated within the Capitol Complex to take advantage of the Capitol location for simulated training sessions. The center shall be designated with clear signage for easy location and recognition as an integral part of the Capitol Complex.
- (5) The Florida Ethics Center shall be funded annually by the Legislature.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
