75 (b) (a) A physical therapist may implement a plan of 76 treatment developed by the physical therapist for a patient or 77 provided for a patient by a practitioner of record or by an 78 advanced registered nurse practitioner licensed under s. 79 464.012. The physical therapist shall refer the patient to or 80 consult with a practitioner of record if the patient's condition 81 is found to be outside the scope of physical therapy. If 82 physical therapy treatment for a patient is required beyond 21 days for a condition not previously assessed by a practitioner 83 84 of record, the physical therapist shall obtain a practitioner of record who will review and sign the plan. For purposes of this 85 paragraph, a health care practitioner licensed under chapter 86 87 458, chapter 459, chapter 460, chapter 461, or chapter 466 and engaged in active practice is eligible to serve as a 88 89 practitioner of record.

90 <u>(c) (b)</u> The use of roentgen rays and radium for diagnostic 91 and therapeutic purposes and the use of electricity for surgical 92 purposes, including cauterization, are not "physical therapy" 93 for purposes of this chapter.

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94 <u>(d) (c)</u> The practice of physical therapy does not authorize 95 a physical therapy practitioner to practice chiropractic 96 medicine as defined in chapter 460, including specific spinal 97 manipulation. For the performance of specific chiropractic 98 spinal manipulation, a physical therapist shall refer the 99 patient to a health care practitioner licensed under chapter 100 460.

101 <u>(e) (d)</u> This subsection does not authorize a physical 102 therapist to implement a plan of treatment for a patient 103 currently being treated in a facility licensed pursuant to 104 chapter 395.

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162 Remove everything before the enacting clause and insert: An act relating to physical therapy; amending s. 486.021, F.S.; 163 revising the definitions of the terms "physical therapist" and 164 165 "practice of physical therapy"; amending s. 486.081, F.S.; 166 authorizing a licensed physical therapist who has a doctoral 167 degree to use certain letters in connection with her or his name or place of business; amending s. 486.135, F.S.; revising the 168 169 terms prohibited from use by a person who is not licensed as a 170 physical therapist or physical therapist assistant; providing an 171 effective date.

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
