14	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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16	Section 1. Subsection (7) of section 483.041, Florida
17	Statutes, is amended to read:
18	483.041 Definitions.—As used in this part, the term:
19	(7) "Licensed practitioner" means a physician licensed
20	under chapter 458, chapter 459, chapter 460, or chapter 461; a
21	certified optometrist licensed under chapter 463; a dentist
22	licensed under chapter 466; a person licensed under chapter 462;
23	a consultant pharmacist or doctor of pharmacy licensed under
24	chapter 465; or an advanced registered nurse practitioner
25	licensed under part I of chapter 464; or a duly licensed
26	practitioner from another state licensed under similar statutes
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27 who orders examinations on materials or specimens for nonresidents of the State of Florida, but who reside in the same 28 29 state as the requesting licensed practitioner. 30 Section 2. Subsection (5) of section 483.181, Florida 31 Statutes, is amended to read: 483.181 Acceptance, collection, identification, and 32 33 examination of specimens.-A clinical laboratory licensed under this part must 34 (5) 35 make its services available to accept a human specimen submitted 36 for examination by a practitioner licensed under chapter 458, 37 chapter 459, chapter 460, chapter 461, chapter 462, chapter 463, 38 s. 464.012, or chapter 466, or to a consultant pharmacist or 39 doctor of pharmacy licensed under chapter 465 if the specimen 40 and test are the type performed by the clinical laboratory. A clinical laboratory may only refuse a specimen based upon a 41 42 history of nonpayment for services by the practitioner. A 43 clinical laboratory shall not charge different prices for its 44 services tests based upon the chapter under which a practitioner 45 submitting a specimen for testing is licensed. 46 Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
