An act relating to insurance claims by third parties; amending s. 627.422, F.S.; providing for the assignment of post-loss benefits; amending s. 627.428, F.S.; prohibiting the award of attorney fees in certain suits brought by a third party to an insurance contract; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 627.422, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

627.422 Assignment of policies.—An insurance A policy, or post-loss benefits provided by an insurance policy, may be assignable, or not assignable, as provided by the terms of the insurance policy its terms. Subject to its terms relating to assignability, any life or health insurance policy under the terms of which the beneficiary may be changed upon the sole request of the policyowner may be assigned either by pledge or transfer of title, by an assignment executed by the policyowner alone and delivered to the insurer, whether or not the pledgee or assignee is the insurer. Any such assignment shall entitle the insurer to deal with the assignee as the owner or pledgee of the policy in accordance with the terms of the assignment, until the insurer has received at its home office written notice by or

on behalf of some other person claiming some interest in the policy in conflict with the assignment.

Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 627.428, Florida Statutes, is amended, and subsection (4) is added to that section, to read:

627.428 Attorney fees Attorney's fee.-

- (2) As to suits based on claims arising under life insurance policies or annuity contracts, no such attorney fees are not attorney's fee shall be allowed if such suit was commenced before the prior to expiration of 60 days after proof of the claim was duly filed with the insurer.
- (4) As to suits based on claims brought by a third party to an insurance contract, such attorney fees are not allowed if such suit was commenced by or on behalf of the third party or if proceeds of a court award would be directed to the third party.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015.
